

The Consolation C U R E

"What you are is God's gift to you and what you become is our gift to God" Hans Urs von Balthasar.

I am a grief survivor - grief that ripped me open by the sudden death of my dad, my role model, in a car crash on the afternoon of my mom's birthday. My cousin and the driver also passed away. The event was not only a source of great loss for me, but it became a source of great strength for my ministry. I am the only one alive to share this story because I was thrown out of the car, out into the air and landed on a highway in the middle of the day. My bones were broken, the femur bone was scattered beyond recognition, and my body was bruised and bathed in blood. This traumatic event opened heart mγ experience God's consolation.

It all boiled down to that one moment, the night after the doctors implanted a steel rod into my leg. I remember the moment I woke up as the anesthesia was wearing off, I was tearful. Nurses thought that I was in pain from the injuries sustained from the accident. But, my tears were not from any physical pain. Instead it was from the unspeakable comfort. I felt the presence of the Lord. He was authentically present at the time of my need. My pain was erased by his presence. My tears were the result of that comforting and indwelling presence. I call it the Presence of His Incarnation. I felt comforted, like my soul felt the touch of heaven. The power of God's grace and peace joined together to offer an unspeakable care. I felt a relief beyond belief in the middle of that night. I do not remember hearing a voice; but I received great solace, strength and support from above. I received perfect emotional strength that I desperately needed at that moment. It was my God, I experienced His presence and I felt His peace.

Therefore I can testify from my story that true consolation comes from God and from His presence alone. Consolation happens when we sense God's unexplainable peace in the midst of dangerous and difficult situations, and when our cognition and emotion are ignited with the unspeakable presence of Almighty God.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and the God of all consolation, who consoles us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to console those who are in any affliction with the consolation with which we ourselves are consoled by God – 2Corinthians 1:3-4.

Paul says that God consoles us in our troubles; therefore, we are encouraged to console one another. Practically speaking, a consolation acronym that I practice in my spiritual care is **C U R E**.

C stands for Connect. The very first step is to receive strength from our maker. It is all about connecting to our Creator. Maybe it is simply

asking God to help you or being sensitive to God's direction. It is important to make it a practice to communicate directly to God in an intimate way.

U stands for Understand. Once you receive strength from above, then you may offer non-judgmental listening presence to the afflicted by being fully present in their world. My *Incarnational* approach is about seeing with the eyes of the other person, listening with the ears of the other person, feeling with the heart of the other person, and thinking with the mind of the other person. I believe this is the way to console those who are in any affliction. Many times I see tears as one of God's natural gifts to us, to cope through difficult times. This brings a sense of great relief and healing to those difficult times.

R stands for Resources. The third step is to explore available resources. I acknowledge that Jesus is the source of my strength, the Holy Spirit is my comforter, and with this awareness, I explore my available supportive resources, including family support, faith community support, and other friendly supports.

E stands for Empower. The final step is to empower one another with the care you have received. It is possible by extracting scripture into coping strategies. Let me share Paul's strategy to experience and to be with God of peace:

Always be full of joy in the Lord. I say it again—rejoice! Let everyone see that you are considerate in all you do. Remember, the Lord is coming soon. Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. Then you will experience God's peace,




