

Conviction - Living Your Faith Everyday

"Even if all fall away on account of you, I never will." replied Peter.

"I tell you the truth," Jesus answered, "this very night before the rooster crows, you will disown me three times." But Peter declared, "Even if I have to die with you, I will never disown you." Later that night - "After a little while, those standing there went up to Peter and said, "Surely you are one of them for your accent gives you away." Peter began to call down curses on himself and he swore to them. "I don't know the man!" Immediately a rooster crowed. Then Peter remembered the word Jesus had spoken, "Before the rooster crows you will disown me three times." And he went outside and wept bitterly. Matthew 26:33-35 and 73-74

At this time, Peter had a serious case of *lack* of conviction; his words were in conflict with his deeds.

Conviction is a noun described as a firm belief, a certainty. In a spiritual context it means saying 'no' to the way of the world, to profess one's spiritual commitment, to stand firm in belief; not compromising, not conforming to society or social expectations. Conviction means having the courage to live your faith each day. What we do, cannot be separated from what we believe. The Holy Spirit leads each of us to profess words of our faith and take actions that speak loudly about our commitment to our Lord and Savior.

Years ago I was in a gas station restroom; where a woman and her daughter were washing their hands. The daughter was

wearing pantaloons, like a Saudi Arabian costume. I commented about her unique 'slacks' and the mother began talking about Mayan culture. She said they were going to a Mayan god's celebration and did I know that this was, the Year of the Woman, according to the Mayan calendar? Standing there, trying to process what she was saying, I said, "I believe in Jesus Christ." "Oh yes," she said; she did too, along with all the other Mayan gods. Wow, I was still processing this Mayan god thing when she walked out the door with her daughter. I was still in a fog wondering what just happened; but there was a stirring in my heart that something was wrong. Later the Holy Spirit convicted me about this encounter. Like Peter, I had a lack of conviction. The Holy Spirit reminded me. "Thou shalt have no other gods before me." It was that simple. These words are the ones I should have said to the Mayan idolizer. I was convicted by the Holy Spirit because I was unable to find the right words to stand firm in my beliefs. I asked for forgiveness for my sin of omission. I stand forgiven.

Swimming against the cultural current

In this secularized, sanitized, politically correct and tolerant culture, as Christ followers, we have to guard ourselves against the cultural current. There is so much pressure to "achieve," to compare, to compete, and to look in all the wrong places for love. This society offers too many distractions. The places to live our convictions are at church and in our home. Our Lord desires us to "keep the Sabbath holy," by attending church. This requires conviction to say 'NO' to the thousands of other activities that occur on

Sunday mornings, and say "YES" to keep our Sunday holy with worship in our church. Careers and work schedules can pull us away from our family. Embracing our family in love, making a commitment to godly family activities, and living a God-centered family life, is our goal, saying no to pleasures that take us away from our precious family time together.

Jesus' half brother, James, reminds us that "Religion that God our Father accepts as pure... to keep oneself from being polluted by the world." He is not referring to the pollution of e-coli in a water source but spiritual pollution. For example, your friends may invite you to see a movie with them and you learn the movie is X-rated with nudity. To remain in spiritual unity with Jesus, unpolluted, you decline to go to the movie and explain why. That's conviction. Showing one's faith is more important, than peer group pressure to go to a movie or other worldly activities.

Even in the face of death

As godly Spirit-led believers, we need to be non-conformists, able to make a conscience decision to remain pure and holy. Two of the best examples of conviction in the Old Testament are found in Daniel. When King Nebuchadnezzar issued a law to bow down and worship a golden image, Shadrach, Meshach and Abedego refused to worship an idol. They were bound and thrown into the fiery furnace. Unwilling to compromise their beliefs even in the face of death, we know God the Father spared their lives; not even a hair on their heads was singed. Daniel also stood firm in his conviction and was required by King Darius' decree to be thrown into the lion's den at





Report on funds collected – From Dec. 2014 to May 2017 our church has received \$118,461 which is \$32,000 short of our committee goal of \$150,000.

Projects completed – The parsonage repairs including a new roof and much needed interior work was accomplished. On the grounds, the dead trees were removed for safety and improving the beauty of our landscape. Our landscape continues to be "beautified", with flowering perennials and annuals to reach out to our community as an inviting and desirable place of worship. We all enjoyed the warmth from the new furnace last winter. We celebrated the removal and replacement of our parking lot last July with the first ever, "Tailgate party."

The next priority is to replace the old projector with a digital projector to greatly improve our Sunday worship together. This is being researched by the Worship Ministry team.

The faithful -Years ago the Sunny Place congregation pledged monies of \$173,765. As we near the end of this campaign we ask you to pray about the original pledge. Fulfilling the pledge will enable our church to replace old windows and complete the "to do" list but more importantly our donations give God the Glory He deserves. We pray to our Lord and Savior that He will enable us to reach our goals as, "Nothing is impossible with God."

We are blessed and so grateful for the donations we have received and know that people have given sacrificially to our campaign. Thank you and we encourage all to continue to press on towards the goal, the completion of our three year Sunny Place campaign.
