



Ministry Reports

<u>Treasurer</u>: Budgeted Bank balance - \$930.56

<u>Worship</u>: There was a meeting Saturday, July 29th. A new projector was purchased and the worship platform may be redesigned with the screen on the back wall, vocalists will be moved to the right and the projector moved closer to the screen. The team agreed to a two week rotation for vocalists and weekly rehearsals. There will be team get-togethers the last Sunday of each month, after the worship service. Tyler is encouraging the use of gifts and talents from our Lord with creativity, special songs, song requests, and instrumentals. The next meeting will be Oct 14th.

<u>Christian Education:</u> There are plans to begin a second adult Bible study; Tyler is interested in leading this class. The church picnic will be Sept. 10.

<u>Hospitality & Encouragement:</u> Continue in prayer for Eva and her family at the loss of Joyce's sister. <u>Missions:</u> Tyler is working with Sherman and Kay Critser on a possible mission trip to South Dakota in 2018. Since there is a shortfall in the Missions Faith Promise money, Pastor plans an offering during a Worship Service in the next couple of weeks.

Stewardship & Support Services: The team is getting organized for the Work Camp, Aug. 10 -12. One of the projects is to remove the siding from the parsonage garage, and after instillation, paint the siding. Our church needs painting also. There will be a list of projects so that the team can match the volunteer's skill set with the needed work. Since this is the first Work Camp, there will be much to do and learn from the experience.

<u>Ladies Ministry:</u> A group of four people traveled to the NICE Foundation in Highland, IL in July to deliver the donations, pillowcase dresses, school supplies, etc. Shirley Beltz, founder, was a gracious hostess; the warehouse was filled to the max with food and supplies. There are four overseas containers filled and shipped to Nicaragua each year. The ministry is supporting the work camp, and encouraging ladies to participate.

<u>Evangelism and Outreach:</u> The next Senior luncheon, will be on Saturday, September, 9th. <u>Fellowship</u>: There will be a Cooking Contest on Sunday, September 24th.






Ladies Breakfast And Church Work Day

In Paul's farewell to the Ephesian Elders, he committed them to God and the word of His grace saying:
"In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak,
remembering the words of the Lord Jesus himself said,
"It is more blessed to give than receive." Acts 20:35

Shirley Beltz, co-founder of the NICE Foundation, was led by Jesus to help the underserved, weak and poor in Nicaragua. Her actions exemplify "it is more blessed to give than receive." Two years ago she visited Sunny Place to share her story with us and demonstrate the power of Jesus using her and her husband as His vessels. The Woman's Ministry was touched by her testimony and began making layettes for Nicaraguan new mothers last year. This year the Woman's Ministry transitioned into the Sewing Sisters and created pillowcase dresses. There were many women and men who donated their time and talents to serve our Lord during these projects. We are thankful for all the people and resources devoted to the NICE Foundation.

In July, a small group of people were able to rent a trailer and take the many donations to the NICE Foundation in Highland, IL. At the warehouse where Shirley lives, we were able to see the tons of packaged meals on pallets to be shipped to Nicaragua. With the spirit and power of the LORD this foundation provides food, school supplies, Bible studies, office equipment and more to a network of churches, schools, hospitals, and Christian ministries. Shirley leads small groups on Mission Trips to Nicaragua to build relationships and assist ministries. There is only one paid employee, a Nicaraguan, who oversees the warehouse and plans the distribution of goods to those in need throughout the country.

The Woman's Ministry will continue this important connection with Shirley and the NICE Foundation to feed the hungry, clothe the needy and take the good news of the gospel to every tribe and community in Nicaragua.
