Lean Not on Your Own Understanding

Many of us, who have dogs, talk to our dogs. But how much of what we say to them do they actually understand? Recently, Glenda and I were pondering this guestion of our dog, Sadie. Studies show that the average dog can understand about 165 different words; in some cases more, if you make a point of training them. When Sadie was about 11 months old, she was professionally trained to understand the basic commands that dogs are typically taught, such as: sit, down, come, and stay. Sadie seems to understand much more than these basic commands. When Glenda or I ask Sadie if she would like to go for a car ride, she gets very excited. Her tail wags, and then she usually heads for the door. Sadie also understands when I pull out her red color leash that its playtime. Sadie has learned to associate the red leash to outside playtime, which soon follows. Dogs can learn all sorts of words, but those that are associated with concrete actions or objects are easiest to learn, especially if they have anything to do with eating, playing, or going to the dog park. One important point, I don't know of anyone who claims that their dogs understand everything they say. In the end, I believe Sadie only understands a very small amount of what we say to her. It's very likely I will never fully understand the extent of everything Sadie's understands.

Our world is so vast, it's simply impossible for anyone, no matter how smart, to know

and understand everything about everything. In varying degrees, most of us struggle at some point or another with our understanding of God's Word. To be a follower of Christ is to be a learner. If we're learners, then we must recognize that we don't know everything, and that we need Christ. We are to set our trust in the Lord entirely and not rely on our worldly wisdom. Scripture has many examples of what it means to trust in the Lord with all your heart, such as: Noah building a great big boat in the middle of dry land when there wasn't a cloud in the sky, despite all the ridicule of his neighbors, just because God said so.

Proverbs 3:5-8 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight. Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord and shun evil. This will bring health to your body and nourishment to your bones."

When we rely on our human understanding, we rely on our natural abilities and our skills, and our life experiences. If things don't go as well as we planned, some will rely on their savings and financial resources, which many fall back on. I remember a story someone told me many years ago, which has helped me understand why I should trust and rely on the Lord and not solely on my own understanding.

There was a young man that did not know God, who worked out every day and was in

excellent shape. He didn't smoke or drink alcohol. This man only ate the very best nutritional food. This man was doing all the rights things to live a long and healthy life. While still a young man, he became ill and was diagnosed with a terminal illness. The man was devastated by the news that he would most likely not live a long life. He was alone in his sorrow. His worldly wisdom had failed him and he was lost. This man had relied solely on his own worldly wisdom for a long and healthy life.

All of us know, living a healthy lifestyle is wise and does contribute to good health. However, when we rely on the Lord and trust in Him, He will never forsake us. With the Lord's help, we can get through anything, including a terminal illness. As Christians, we have the promise of eternal life. What is important, no matter how many precious years in this world that God allots to us, we need to make them count for His purpose. Commit your way to the Lord and trust in Him, and He will act in kindness, justice and righteousness.

Jeremiah 9-23-24 "This is what the Lord says: Let not the wise man boast of his wisdom or the strong man boast of his strength or the rich man boast of his riches, but let him who boasts boast about this: that he understands and knows me, that I am the Lord, who exercises kindness, justice and righteousness on earth, for in these I delight, declares the Lord."

Trusting the Lord entirely and not relying solely our worldly wisdom will bring many blessings and rewards from the Lord. This doesn't mean we'll never face difficult circumstances in life. Following Christ is not a recipe for success in worldly terms at all. If we put our trust in the Lord, He will be there






New and Old Business

The Mihsills Jenny, Bobby, Rease & Moore Our sponsored Missionaries in Cote d'Ivoire, West Africa



Meet Bobby and Jenny Mihsill our missionaries to Cote d'Ivoire

Jenny was born in Seymour, Indiana. Bobby was born and raised in Meghalaya, India, where his family have been part of the Church of God. A powerful encounter at a youth camp at the age of 18, led him to commit his life to Christ. After graduating in Business/Accounting, he worked for a non-governmental organization teaching street children. The seed for missions was first planted in Jenny's heart at a youth session at Oregon State Camp meeting. Jenny answered the call to full time cross-cultural ministry at the International Youth Convention in 1996. Jenny graduated from Anderson University in 2003, and moved to Tokyo, Japan, to serve as a Special Assignment Missionary (SAM) for Global Missions for 3 years. She then enrolled in the Anderson University School of Theology. Bobby met Jenny in 2007, in Kolkata, where she was completing her internship in India as part of her Master of Arts in Intercultural Service. They were married in 2010.

<u>The Assignment:</u> Bobby & Jenny work alongside the Church of God in Côte d'Ivoire, teaching at IBAO (West Africa Bible Institute); help the national church develop & train leaders for the Children of Promise program; & coordinate work camp/ministry teams coming to Cote d'Ivoire.

<u>About Cote d'Ivoire</u>: The major religions are Muslim, Christianity, and indigenous. Population is around 21,504,162 (2011). The language is mostly French, and about 60 native dialects. The capital is Abidjan, the total area is 124,500 sq. miles. The Church of God began in 1992 and re -established in 1997. They have about 13 churches and 1800 believers.


