

The Prophecy of Christ Foretold and Fulfilled

Most people would like to know the future. Some of us would like to be informed and inspired to live a meaningful life in the present day. Prophecy does not originate from deities, gut feelings, past experiences, skilled manipulation of objects or even prophet's own reflection. Prophecy is a revelation of God that is transformational and inspirational in nature. It brings wonder, meaning, peace, joy, hope and blessing to the receiver. One of the most wonderful things about Biblical prophecy is the fact that their visions are eternal (ancient times they are called "seers"), words are insightful and carried through the Holy Spirit.

Simon Peter, a servant and apostle of Jesus Christ, tries to define prophecy for us,

"For we have not followed cunningly devised fables, when we made known unto you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but were eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received from God the Father honour and glory, when there came such a voice to him from the excellent glory, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. And this voice which came from heaven we heard, when we were with him in the holy mount. We have also a more sure word of prophecy; whereunto ye do well that ye take heed, as unto a light that shineth in a dark place, until the day dawn, and the day star arise in your hearts: Knowing this first, that no prophecy of the scripture is of any private

interpretation. For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost" (2Peter 1:16-21).

Prophecy was intended to reveal a message from God in the days of ancient Israel. Yes, God still speaks to his people; but one must discern before saying that someone is God's messenger, or His spokesman, or this is a word from God. Today when someone claims be to speaking "prophetically," we ask: Where is this coming from? Which dreams? What is the point? We should check prophetic words against the written revelation, the Holy Bible, because God never contradicts Himself. Also, we may see whether or not their prophecies come true, as described in ancient test for discerning prophets (Deuteronomy 18:21-22). But sometimes our distrust (fear and pain of the past) can lead us to ignore prophetic words we desperately need to hear!

For example, Prophet Isaiah prophesied about the coming child:

For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and peace there shall

be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will perform this (Isaiah 9:6-7).

This is an unmatched event that is documented in the pages of history. It is not just a prophecy of birth of an innocent baby boy. The greatest of all; birthed at a stable among the cattle, and in between the battles of the day. The prophecy is all about Jesus, the only hope of humanity. Scripture refers this event as "the word became flesh." The one and only one (the only Begotten of the Father) who was born in human form, full of grace and truth. He brings wonder, peace, joy and hope. He is the messenger of the great counsel, mighty God, father of the everlasting age, and the source of all blessings. He is called Immanuel, the God who cannot wait to pitch a tent in our hearts and minds to impart His abundant life. He is the bright Morning Star (Revelation 22: 16) who arises in our hearts. When the Magi saw the star, they "rejoiced with exceeding great joy."

Luke, a physician wrote the words of our Savior as follows:

Jesus said to them, "These are the words I spoke to you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about Me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets, and Psalms (Luke 24:44).



Meet Larry and LeAnn Sellers Missionaries to Cote d'Ivoire

Larry was born in Texas, but his childhood years were spent in France and Algeria. He earned bachelor's degrees in music and missions from Gulf Coast Bible College (now Mid-America Christian University), and a master of arts in religion, with a concentration in Christian missions, from Anderson School of Theology. LeAnn was raised in Florida and earned a BS degree in elementary education at Gulf Coast Bible College. They married in December, 1985, and then completed a full term of service in Haiti. Their first child, Laura, was born while serving there; their son, Lee, was born during their term in Rwanda and Congo. The Sellers family has adjusted to living in seven different countries on three continents, been exposed to several different languages, and lived in conditions from civil war to coup d'état. In spite of people's view, that missionaries suffer great deprivation, they feel very fortunate to have raised their children abroad for the numerous advantages it has offered.

The Sellers began their term in Cote d'Ivoire in 1996, planting the first French speaking church in West Africa for the Church of God. They have been instrumental in the starting and leading of West Africa Bible Institute (IBAO) and are teaching there. They are also involved in the planting of a work in neighboring Burkina Faso.

The Assignment: Larry and LeAnn help the church develop programs for leadership and church administration. They work alongside the leadership of the Church of God in Cote d'Ivoire to create strategies for planting French-speaking churches. They also develop French literature for the church in Africa. LeAnn also carries responsibilities in the women's work, a literacy program, and Christian education.

More about Cote d'Ivoire: or Ivory Coast, a country of more than 17 million people located in western Africa. For several hundred years, the country was a French colony. Gaining independence in 1960, Cote d'Ivoire was one of the most stable and prosperous African states until the late 1990s. Then falling cocoa prices and political turmoil have hurt the standard of living for many Ivorians. The country is just now recovering from a civil war that began in the fall of 2002. During the civil war national Church of God pastors and members took in the displaced, contributed to relief funds, and spoke to the needs of the people. The Church of God in Cote d'Ivoire was challenged by the civil war, but has risen to the challenge.

"Oh Come, All Ye Faithful, Joyful and Triumphant" Tis the season to celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior - Jesus,

who changed history, the Son of God, who was born to save the world from sin. Let us join together to sing in exultation,
Glory to God, let us adore Him – **Christ.**


