

God's Vivid Presence

Growing up in a time when radio and television were the state of the art, I understood that the sound and images we saw on the screen and heard from the speakers were traveling through the air, even though we could not see it. I, of course, didn't understand how it worked, but I knew it was happening – it was coming through the antenna – because what we were seeing and hearing was clearly real.

Today, we have far more traveling through the air waves. Wi-Fi signals, satellite transmission, microwave communication, infrared frequencies – all measured at megahertz and gigahertz speeds, and probably more. But we know it is all real – and that there is a lot of it – because we see and hear what comes flooding through our devices every day. There is a constant presence of content delivered to us through space and air that we cannot see or hear, but we know it's there.

So why is hard to believe that God, who is the Creator of all sight and sound, and light and waves, can communicate with us and relate to us in spiritual ways? He created all that makes it possible to do it in the physical world and realm; so what makes it strange that He makes it possible to do that in the spiritual realms? We are, after all, spiritual beings every bit as much as we are physical.

He made us that way – created in His own image – so we could relate to God, who is Spirit. This is why Adam and Eve were able to hear the sound of the LORD, God, walking through the garden of Eden, and able to talk to Him, and hear His voice as He spoke. We don't know if they could *physically* see and hear God, but the presence of God was very real with them in Eden. Whether it

was physical or not we don't know, but it was definitely spiritual.

After the fall, Adam and Eve were separated from God and expelled from the garden. But God continued to relate and communicate with them and others. We see that with Cain, Enoch, and Noah. But we have no evidence that any of it was physical.

And after the flood, we know Abraham, Hagar, Jacob, and Joseph, all sensed the presence of God. The LORD had a lot to say to Abraham. And when Hagar was in the desert, distraught about being cast out by Sarah, the angel of the LORD encouraged her, telling her to go back. Listen to her response:

13 She gave this name to the LORD who spoke to her: "You are the God who sees me," for she said, "I have now seen the One who sees me."

Genesis 16:13

Jacob told his wives that "the God of my father has been with me," in Genesis 31:5. And in Genesis 35:3 he said, "let us go up to Bethel, where I will build an altar to God, who answered me in the day of my distress, and who has been with me wherever I have gone."

Pharaoh said of Joseph, "Can we find anyone like this man, one in whom is the spirit of God?" And listen to this conversation Moses had with God, in Exodus 33:

15 Then Moses said to him, "If your Presence does not go with us, do not send us up from here. 16 How will anyone know that you are pleased with me and with your people unless you go with

us? What else will distinguish me and your people from all the other people on the face of the earth?" 17 And the LORD said to Moses, "I will do the very thing you have asked, because I am pleased with you and I know you by name." Exodus 33:15-17

God spoke to the prophets, through the Holy Spirit. He told them that the Son of God, the Christ, was being sent to a lost and dark world to free the captives, and redeem them from their sins. So when Jesus came into the world, the presence of God came to us in flesh. John tells us:

14 The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the [Only Begotten], who came from the Father, full of grace and truth. John 1:14

When Jesus spoke to the Samaritan woman at the well of Jacob, He said to her:

10 ... "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." He said:

13 ... "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, 14 but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

John 4:10, 13-14

Jeremiah said that God was the fountain of living water. Who can offer God and eternal life, but God Himself? So here she was, in the presence of God, in person.

Jesus, of course, had to purchase our redemption with His blood, and leave this world, but not without assuring us of His, and God's, continued presence. He said:

15 "If you love me, you will obey what I command. 16 And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Counselor to be with you forever- 17 the Spirit of truth.

The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. 18 I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. 19 Before long. the world will not see me anymore, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live. 20 On that day you will realize that I am in my Father, and you are in me, and I am in you. ... 23 ... If anyone loves me, he will obey my teaching. My Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. " John 14:15-20, 23

If you love Jesus – if you have received Him, as God in your heart, and received the gift of God's Spirit – God lives in you. Jesus was sent from the Father to make it all possible, and the Holy Spirit is God's gift too. So when you receive what God has sent, the presence of God is palpable. God is with vou.

Jesus said:

19 "Again, I tell you that if two of you on earth agree about anything you ask for, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. 20 For where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them." Matthew 18:19-20

God's presence is real. You will know it when you open your heart to Him – when you drink the living water, when you receive the gifts of God. The patriarchs, prophets, and disciples did. You can too.

Jesus assures us, "Surely, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."



THEIR MINISTRY FOCUS


Kris is the lead pastor of Peninsula Community Church in Auckland, New Zealand, and Megan is involved in the ministry of the church. The goal is to produce a healthy, growing church that is transforming its community through Christ and expanding the Kingdom of God.

THEIR STORY

Kris and Megan have been active in the church for their entire lives, having grown up in homes committed to Christ. Kris has been in vocational ministry for more than fifteen years, and Megan is a physical therapist. Kris graduated with a bachelor's degree from Anderson University and went on to earn MATS and MDiv degrees from Liberty University. Megan graduated from Rocky Mountain College with a degree in exercise science and then earned a doctor of physical therapy degree from the University of Montana.

When the Gilberts returned to the States after nearly three years of service at a church in New Zealand in the Wellington area, they weren't expecting to return. They settled in Billings, Montana, where Kris took a position as a discipleship pastor. But then in 2014 God called them back to New Zealand, and they were amazed at the work that God was doing and the doors he was opening for a return to ministry in a country and to a people that they both passionately love. The Gilberts' assignment in New Zealand is a partnership between Peninsula Community Church, Indiana Ministries of the Church of God, and Global Strategy.

The Gilbert family arrived back in New Zealand in July of 2014, and after spending about six months in the culture along with listening and praying, they, along with their board, decided to replant Westside Christian Fellowship as Peninsula Community Church. Today, the church is thriving, growing, and expanding in outreach into their community.


