Enlighten the Eyes of My Heart

Open the Eyes of My Understanding and Enlighten Me with Your Knowledge!

Since I was a small child, I have always believed in God. I would go to church with my father and brothers on most Sundays while I was growing up. That was essentially the extent of my relationship with God. I knew about Jesus, but I really did not know or understand about having a personal relationship with Him.

Many of you know that Glenda and I were married at Sunny Place. Looking back on those early years now, I can honestly say I was not a Christian at that time. I had everything you could want, yet I was still unhappy. It's hard to explain the hopelessness of the unhappiness that I was feeling. I was looking at my life and all I could see in the years that laid ahead was a continual cycle of making money and buying stuff. This was very unfulfilling to me. I kept asking myself, is this what life is all about. I was living in darkness.

My first thought was, I'm in my twenties and I should be happy, there must be something medically wrong. I made an appointment with my doctor and had a complete physical. My doctor couldn't find anything wrong. He asked if there was something in my life causing me stress. This feeling of unhappiness was not stress related. The unhappiness was from the despair from recognizing that the things of this world were not fulfilling and only brought temporary joy. After months and months of feeling this deep unhappiness, God put it on my heart and mind that this was a spiritual matter. I began searching and seeking out Jesus to be the center of my life. It didn't happen overnight for me. But with much help from the Holy Spirit and faithful servants of God who He sent to support and disciple me, I said the prayer of salvation and finally turned my life over to Jesus. I know now that God was working within me to enlighten my heart and mind, so I would know and live a life according to His purpose.

I never read the Bible much growing up. Once I was saved, like it is for many new Christians, many things in the Bible seemed somewhat confusing. I knew that it wasn't God's will for me to be confused when I read His Word, but I didn't know how to overcome it.


In Paul's prayer in Ephesians 1, We learn to ask

This is where we will become empowered in a new way when we read Scriptures and pray because we



will no longer be filtering things with our natural mind based on our past experience or upbringing.

God, in His incredible love for us, is longing to speak to us and to give us wisdom and understanding. When we rely on the Lord and trust in Him, He will never forsake us. Commit your way to the Lord and trust in him and you will receive His inheritance and live in the light of the His hope and immeasurable power.



Ministry Reports

Treasurer: Budgeted Bank Balance \$ 1,252.84 Giving for Dec. \$21,413.84 Expenses for December, \$16,168.62. Our church donated \$2,150 to CWC for the Christ Birthday Offering. **Worship & Prayer**: There was a meeting Jan. 6. The Mission and Vision statements were revised and placed on the church website. Effie prepared and shared spiritual guidelines because worship isn't simply an event or place. Lifestyle Worship means we are called to offer our lives as living sacrifices. The team reviewed the shared responsibilities and ownership of the ministry. Commitment cards were given to each team member to embrace and keep close to his or her hearts. As Director and facilitator, Effie is planning the worship services in advance and asked team members to provide the Sundays that they are willing to serve.

<u>Christian Education & Fellowship</u>: Pastor Pete reported that he will begin the next Discipleship Adult class on Sunday, Jan. 13.

Pastoral Care & Encouragement: The ministry is sending cards and flowers to our brothers and sisters who are in need of encouragement. Pastoral Care continues as needed.

<u>Outreach & Missions</u>: The Senior Luncheon will be this Saturday and the ministry meeting will follow our worship service on Jan. 13. The Missions team is looking into a program called Laundry Love which our church may begin in the near future.

<u>Stewardship & Support Services</u>: The LED lighting upgrade in our church is complete and Com. Edison will pay 53% of the expense. Our expense is about \$500 less than expected. The blower on one of the church's furnaces ceased working. It was a blessing to have the blower replaced quickly and with labor donated for a greatly reduced expense.

New and Old Business

• The Elders carefully reviewed the 2018 expenses and 2019 budget prepared by Glenda Kasza as treasurer. Phyllis Clark moved to accept the proposed budget. Nona Koivula seconded the motion. The 2019 budget will be presented to the congregation during the Annual Business Meeting to be held Sunday January 27, 2019.

Meet the Critsers, Sherman & Kay Native American Ministries Scottsbluff, Nebraska


Since January 2013 Reverend Sherman and Kay Critser have been making themselves at home in Scottsbluff, Nebraska after coming back to the United States from Cote D'Ivoire in Africa.

Initially, much work was needed to repair and restore the Scottsbluff Intercultural Chapel, connecting buildings, and the parsonage. Despite the construction, services continued in and around the Chapel.

Besides pastoring at Scottsbluff Intercultural Chapel, the Critser's also provide leadership development to those serving Native Americans in Scottsbluff and Alliance, NE, in Pass Creek, Wounded Knee and Rapid City, SD, and in Klagetoh, AZ.

Rev. Sherman has been leading online leadership classes for the pastors. Prayer concerns include the need for more pastors to serve at the different sites. Pastor Sherman recommends viewing "The Children of the Plains" aired by ABC, for supporting partners to understand some of the challenges and opportunities that they face. The Church of God Ministries is currently working on their website section for Native American ministries.


