

Ready for Heaven

When I first started thinking about "Readiness," I had some other ideas to write about; but since I received the news about my brother Helmuth's passing from this life to the next, to be with the Lord, my thoughts began heading in a different direction. I'm thinking, now, about how important it is for all of us to be ready to do the same.

My brother was ready for this. I don't mean that he spent a lot of time thinking about it — I don't believe he did. But he lived his life serving God. He lived his life helping people, serving others, caring for the elderly, and using his gifts to be a resource to anyone who had a need. Jesus said, "In as much as you have done it unto one of the least of these, my brothers, you have done it unto me." That was my brother. He served his neighbors, his family, the church — everyone he could. He served Christ. He did this his entire life. And in doing so, he was preparing, storing up treasures in heaven, making himself ready to receive his inheritance.

Jesus said:

19 "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. 20 But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. 21 For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Matthew 6:19-21

When you devote yourself to God, and to serving people with the love of Jesus, here, your heart is in the right place. You are actually making spiritual deposits in heaven. It's an investment in eternity. Earthly treasures and investments will never leave this world. But serving Christ, loving your neighbor, being peacemakers, helping the needy – these will be treasure for you beyond the grave. This, you *can* take with you. Your heart is already in heaven. And in *this* way, you are preparing – making yourself ready for that day.

Paul talked often about being ready for that day. He said:

10 I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, 11 and so, somehow, to attain to the resurrection from the dead.

Philippians 3:10-11

You can see he was not only considering what his devotion to Christ would entail in the remainder of his days here, but was also thinking beyond this life. And his days here were all about following in the footsteps of Christ Jesus in order to attain resurrection from the dead. There's no question, Paul was getting ready.

For the church, he also taught that we should be thinking about another day – the day of the Lord's return. And if he told the churches back then to be prepared for it, how much more should we then be ready? It's nearer now than ever. Listen to his words:

4 But you, brothers, are not in darkness so that this day should surprise you like a thief. 5 You are all sons of the light and sons of the day. We do not belong to the night or to the darkness. 6 So then, let us not be like others, who are asleep, but let us be alert and self-controlled. 7 For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, get drunk at night. 8 But since we belong to the day, let us be self-controlled, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet.

1 Thessalonians 5:4-8

Peter also tells us to be ready, living our lives, here, even as strangers – by faith, with hope in God, and in reverent fear.

17 Since you call on a Father who judges each man's work impartially, live your lives as strangers here in reverent fear. 18 For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed from the empty way of life handed down to you from your forefathers, 19 but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect. 20 He was chosen before the creation of the world, but was revealed in these last times for your sake. 21 Through him you believe in God, who raised him from the dead and glorified him, and so your faith and hope are in God.

1 Peter 1:17-21

As you can see, he wants us to be thinking about the eternal rather than the temporal, what is imperishable rather than what is perishable. He is

My sister, Esther, said that on the day, hours before Helmuth passed, he leaned over to a friend that was next to him, and whispered in her ear, "I'm going to heaven." And it was *that* night that he took his last breath.

He was ready. ... How about you?

10 Therefore, my brothers, be all the more eager to make your calling and election sure. For if you do these things, you will never fall, 11 and you will receive a rich welcome into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

2 Peter 1:10-11

screen door repaired; threshold for outside classroom door replaced to make it weather tight.



Meet Ernie & Lori Nicholas Missionaries to Kenya Kima International School of Theology (KIST)

Ernie serves alongside the staff as the Academic Dean. He also provides administrative and teaching support.

Lori serves alongside the staff as the school's nurse, providing healthcare for students and staff through the clinic. She also helps coordinate the missions experience groups who visit KIST.

Kima International School of Theology (KIST) began in 1995 as a joint effort across English-speaking East Africa to train leaders for work in the Church of God. It draws from many East African countries, with the majority of the 82 current students coming from Kenya, Tanzania, and Uganda.

Kima International School of Theology exists to equip students to become effective and influential servant leaders, transforming and strengthening the church, community and world.

History

Christian Missionaries from South Africa began working in the Bunyore area of Western Kenya in 1905 and began education on various levels to train church leaders for ministry. In 1922 the Church of God, Anderson, Indiana assumed the mission work. In 1954 the Missionary Board of the Church of God and the leaders of the Church of God in East Africa (Kenya) began a residential training institution for the preparation of church ministers in Kenya. This training institution became known as Kima Theological College (KTC). In 1995 the Church of God in East Africa (Kenya) gave the land of Kima Theological College to a new multi-national Board of Directors to begin Kima International School of Theology (KIST), which has been in operation since that time.










