Cleansing! Needed for Eternal Life

CLEANSING

Merriam Webster states that "cleansing" means: to rid of impurities, remove toxins from the body, to make someone or something clean. Isn't that what God wants for us? I know this is what God wants for us. That's why there are so many Bible verses discussing the heart, because Gods word is clear that the condition of your heart is critical in our walk with the Lord. The 1st verse that comes to my mind is Psalm 24:3-4, "Who may ascend the mountain of the Lord? Who may stand in his holy place? The one who has clean hands and a pure heart." Psalm119:1 says, "Blessed are those whose ways are blameless, who walk according to the law of the Lord." Oh and this one from Matthew 23:25-27, "Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You clean the outside of the cup and dish, but inside they are full of greed and self- indulgence. Blind Pharisee! First clean the inside of the cup and dish, and then the outside will also be clean. Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You are like whitewashed tombs, which look beautiful on the outside but on the inside are full of the bones of the dead and everything unclean."

I know I could go on and on, with verse after verse, so I would like to share some thoughts of my own. When I first started to write this article, about two months ago, I thought of something that happened with me when I was much younger; and in my mind I think it relates to this article, and what is really meant by our cleansing.

Have you ever tasted spoiled milk? Well..... I did and it's not good. I didn't know it had expired, and I started to drink it, but I knew at that first sip that it was bad. So I did the only logical thing that a young lazy kid would do. I put it back in the fridge and drank from the new gallon of milk that was not expired. I told my mom about the spoiled milk and she said she would take care of it. Now, there wasn't much left in that gallon of spoiled milk, but there was some. I don't remember if it was the next day, or the day after, I had poured some milk on my cereal from that new gallon, and guess what it tasted like? Yep, you got it!! Spoiled milk. "Ma why does this milk taste spoiled," I asked. She told me, "we can't afford to be wasting food," so she poured the little bit of spoiled milk into the gallon of good milk. So just that little bit of spoiled milk, mixed in with the almost full gallon of new milk, spoiled it.

That's how I feel about Cleansing; just a small amount of anything unclean or impure will mix with all that is good, clean and pure, and it can spoil all of it. What would be the point of cleansing if we are just going to get dirty again? In my mind that would be like giving a pig a bath and expecting it to stay clean. We have to stay cleansed so we can be like that church in Ephesus, "Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless."


Ephesians 5:25b-27

Having to write this article made me think about my own cleansing and the reason for doing it. I didn't think I was a bad person, but (and there is always a but) after coming to this church and hearing the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth (my little sense of humor), I felt something inside when the pastor had asked if anyone was interested in being baptized. He said to let him know because there were a few others interested. So I thought about it and let the pastor know that I wanted to be baptized also. Well as the time drew closer, and the pastor had told us about the verses we should look at for a good understanding and the true reason for doing it, I kept getting things in my head that were telling me what I had to change, because if I didn't, then the baptism would just be nothing more than a dunking in some water with no reason for it.

Now, I would love to tell you that as soon as I came up out of the water, a dove came down and a voice said, "this is my child whom I love and am well pleased," but there were a lot of witnesses that had seen the whole thing, and would know that I was lying; and I am pretty sure there is a lot of Scripture that tells us not to lie. Anyway, after that day, I know the Holy Spirt has been with me, because I still get that voice that tells me what to do, and how to do it the right way. I don't look at cleansing as a one and done thing. This is an ongoing thing that should be happening 24-7.

Every day, I ask the Holy Spirit to be with me, and guide me throughout the day, to do what is right for His purpose, and His will to keep me clean, so I can continue to do His work. Now I can tell you this, there are times when He tells me, "You shouldn't have done that," or "You shouldn't have said that." John wrote in 1 John 3:9, "No one who lives in him keeps on sinning. No one who is born of God will continue to sin, because God's seed remains in them: they cannot go on sinning, because they have been born of God."

Whenever I write an article, I try to read as much Scripture as I can about the topic, so I might get inspired and be able to write something. As I was searching and reading, I started to feel overwhelmed, because there is



so much Scripture that relates to cleansing. I felt like I read half of the Bible in a couple of months and there was still a lot more, because one thing lead to another, and then another. Where will it stop; when will it end? IT DOESN'T!! It's like the never ending story, all about cleansing. So I would like to leave you with a few Scriptures that stood out to me:

It is God's will that you should be sanctified. For God did not call us to be impure, but to live a holy life. Therefore, anyone who rejects this instruction does not reject a human being but God, the very God who gives you his Holy Spirit. 1 Thessalonians 4:3, 7-8

At one time we too were foolish, disobedient, deceived and enslaved by all kinds of passions and pleasures. We lived in malice and envy, being hated and hating one another. But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. New and Old Business


- The NAC and General Assembly for Church of God will be held in Orlando FL June 27 to 30. Pastor Pete and Carla will depart June 24 and return July 1.




