

### We Must Watch...

When I started thinking about the December topic of the month, "watchfulness," I did a word search for it in the KJV Bible. Guess what? I didn't find it. However, I did find the word "watch." Did you know the word "watch" is used 114 times in the Bible: 73 times in the Old Testament, and 43 times in the New Testament? (Just a side note for you trivia players.)

After discovering the fact that the actual word. "watchfulness," wasn't in the KJV, my curiosity left me wanting to know the difference between the two words; so I went to the good old Merriam-Webster to find out. Watchfulness means watchful, vigilant, wide-awake, alert, meaning being on the lookout especially for danger or opportunity. Watch means look at, or observe. attentively over a period of time, exercise care, caution, or restraint about. At this point, several thoughts about the definitions, and two Scripture passages I have read over the years, came to my mind that I want to share with you at the beginning and the end. In the meantime, let's look at five areas where we all must keep watch in our own lives, along with what the Word has to say about it.

The very first Scripture that came to my mind when I starting thinking about this topic was 1 Peter 5:8 (KJV), "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour. As Christians, we must be vigilant about watching our daily walk here on earth in several areas of our lives."

We must **WATCH what we think about**. Philippians 4:8 (KJV) said, "<sup>8</sup> Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be

any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things." If we fail to bring our thoughts into the captivity of the Lord, we can be dominated by negative, and even evil thoughts, which influence our attitude. Proverbs 23:7a (KJV), "Terras he thinketh in his heart, so is he." In other words, where your heart is, your thoughts will be also.

#### We must WATCH what we see and hear.

Millions of people are being brainwashed daily by scenes of immorality and violence in TV shows, and what they hear in the TV shows, movies and through the commercials & ads that run. Don't get me wrong here, I'm not saying you shouldn't watch TV. I watch TV and movies to this day. However, what I am saying, and what I have learned over time, is that we need to exercise more care and caution in this area of our lives, being more watchful in what we allow our eyes to see and ears to hear through television, movies, and music, even on the various social media apps that are out there. You know that old term "WWJD" (What Would Jesus Do). What would Jesus want us to see or hear? Surely not what the world offers, but that which aids our spiritual growth and strengthens our faith. Our prayer and desire should be as written in Psalm 119:18 (KJV), "18 Open thou mine eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of thy law."

We must **WATCH what we say.** My entire life when my mom was alive, and even now 24 years after she went home to the Lord, I'm reminded of a couple sayings that she would tell us kids from childhood through adulthood. "If you don't have anything nice to say about someone, don't say anything at all", the other being, "We have two ears and one mouth so we can listen twice as much as we speak." Scripture tells us in *Matthew 12:36-37 (KJV)*, "<sup>36</sup>But I say unto you, That every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment. <sup>37</sup>For by

thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned." Also in Colossians 4:6 (KJV), "<sup>6</sup> Let your speech be always with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man."

We must **WATCH what we do.** Ephesians 2:10 (KJV): "10 For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them." No matter how often we say and profess our Christianity, people still want to see the difference. They are watching. They will observe us and see that difference when we walk like Christ walked when He was on this earth. Truly, actions speak louder than words! Lets be a peculiar people as it is said in Titus 2:14 (KJV), "14 Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works."

We must **WATCH** where we go. Things have changed so much since my childhood days, in all areas, including the church front. In the early days, my parents would get us up very early on a Sunday morning, making breakfast and then we would all get ready to head off to church for Sunday school and worship service. The reason we would have to get up so early was because we didn't have a car and had to take 2-3 buses to church. After church we might stay for a dinner and hang out till evening service. Sometimes, we would go to someone's house, or have folks over at our house and spend the afternoon together. Then around 5pm that evening, we would get ready and head back to church for Sunday night service. After getting a car, we started attending Wednesday night Bible study in addition to Sundays. My parents' lives were centered on serving the Lord, fellowshipping with God's family, and raising us to love the Lord with all our heart.

It is a tragedy to me that there are more people across the world letting other things become a priority in their lives over gathering together for worshiping, fellowship, breaking bread and prayer, as referred to in *Acts 2:42 (KJV)*, "<sup>42</sup> And they continued stedfastly in the apostles"

In closing, the second Scripture passage that came to my mind, when thinking about watchfulness, was the parable of the 10 virgins, found in Matthew 25:1-13 (KJV): "1Then shall the kingdom of heaven be likened unto ten virgins, which took their lamps, and went forth to meet the bridegroom. <sup>2</sup> And five of them were wise, and five were foolish.3 They that were foolish took their lamps, and took no oil with them: <sup>4</sup> But the wise took oil in their vessels with their lamps. 5 While the bridegroom tarried, they all slumbered and slept. <sup>6</sup> And at midnight there was a cry made, Behold, the bridegroom cometh; go ye out to meet him. <sup>7</sup> Then all those virgins arose, and trimmed their lamps. 8 And the foolish said unto the wise, Give us of your oil; for our lamps are gone out. <sup>9</sup> But the wise answered, saying, Not so; lest there be not enough for us and you: but go ye rather to them that sell, and buy for yourselves. 10 And while they went to buy, the bridegroom came; and they that were ready went in with him to the marriage: and the door was shut. 11 Afterward came also the other virgins, saying, Lord, Lord, open to us. 12 But he answered and said. Verily I say unto you. I know you not.<sup>13</sup> Watch therefore, for ye know neither the day nor the hour wherein the Son of man cometh."

Be Watchful I Be Alert !

With this in mind each one of us must ask ourselves, "Am I ready if the Lord was to come back right now?"

Therefore, my prayer for Sunny Place is found in Hebrews 10:23-25 (KJV): "<sup>23</sup> Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;) <sup>24</sup> And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: <sup>25</sup> Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching."

   Please comply with these requests.




