

The World Reconciled is the World Saved

I have said many times that we do not live in the worst of times. We do not live in the best of times either - the best days only covered Genesis 1 and 2. But often, we hear the moans of those who believe humanity, and the world we live in, is so desperately lost and depraved that there is little hope to save it. The hand-wringing comes either with complaints that we need a new president – a better one – or better leaders in this world. who can fix it and save the world; or that the church has failed, and the only thing left that can stop the downward slide is the return of Jesus. But the reality is that salvation has come, and has been saving souls for two thousand years, and the world is being reconciled, even now, as you read these very words.

If you think back to the condition of the world at various times in history, you will find several times that were far more bleak than what is happening today. In Noah's time, the world was so full of violence and immorality that it grieved God's heart, and His Spirit would no longer contend with men the way He had up to that point. No one was spared in the world except Noah and his family. Only he was found to be blameless in God's eyes.

The days of the judges of Israel were dark as well. Idolatry was rampant in the kingdoms of the world. But even though God had rescued the Israelites from Egypt and revealed Himself to them as the only true and living God, the subsequent generations of Israel kept falling back into the idolatry of the nations around them. So the people, who

were supposed to be the light of God to the world, were instead consumed and defiled by the sin that surrounded them.

The same with the kings of Israel and Judah. After the days of David and Solomon, the kings of Israel and Judah were again enticed into idolatry. The result was Israel overtaken and decimated by Assyria, and Judah by the Babylonians. Jerusalem and the temple were destroyed, and all that was left was a small remnant of people, most of whom were taken into captivity in Babylon. There was only a handful of believers in the LORD, God, in the entire world at that time.

And what about in Jesus' time, when He was in the world? He Himself said over and over how wicked and depraved that generation was. The people were oppressed, not only by the Romans, and by their own religious leaders, but also by demon possession and debilitating sicknesses – the practice of the occult and sorcery was everywhere.

But Jesus came, as the Son of God, and as the Lamb of God, with a mission to give His life for the sins of the world. And He persevered in His mission. He was the only pure and perfect sacrifice because He was the only man who had never given in to sin; and no greater value could be placed on His sacrifice because He was the Son of God. By His death and resurrection, He reconciled the great debt that the sins of the world had incurred with God. And thereby, salvation for the world had begun.

For everyone who believes and receives Him, the debt of sin is canceled, and one by one the world is being reconciled ... but not only reconciled: it is being saved, because now we live again in the power and presence of God. Sin has been defeated, and the new life we live, we live for God. Listen to how Paul describes it here:

6 You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. 7 Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die. 8 But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

9 Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him! 10 For if, when we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life! 11 Not only is this so, but we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation. Romans 5:6-11

This reconciliation and salvation changes the world. One by one, as each person's life is reconciled and saved, the world begins to be made new. And it changes everything about the way we see the world, too. It changes everything for us. This message of reconciliation becomes ours to share. Listen to Paul again:

16 So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer. 17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come! 18 All this is from

And the world is vastly better because of it. People are receiving Christ Jesus even today.

Yes, the world is still full of trouble and chaos. The battle of good and evil, and battle for souls will continue. But the world is being reconciled and saved every time a soul says "Yes!" to the invitation to receive Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.

And if you are in need of being reconciled to God, it is not too late for you either. Jesus' death paid the penalty for your sins too. He rose from the grave and is alive today sitting at the right hand of God. But if you will receive Him, He will sit on the throne of your heart as well. He will save you and empower you. You will be a new creation, and the world will be better for it – your world will be, for sure.

Be reconciled to God, so that in Christ Jesus, you might become the righteousness of God.

Ministry Reports

Treasurer: Budgeted Bank Balance \$1,250.59 Giving \$25,246.15 Expenses \$25,317.09

Worship & Prayer: On Jan. 5th the Worship medley consisted of 9 Hymns requested in advance. The congregation sang with spirited joy. There will be at least 4 more requested Hymn Sundays this year. There are 6 Worship Ministry team meetings planned for 2020. There are three families who will offer home worship during this year. The structure, dates and planning for these home worship events will be discussed in January. The Worship meeting will be Sunday Jan. 19 after the afternoon of prayer.

Christian Education & Fellowship: There will be a pot luck dinner on Sunday, Jan. 26 immediately prior to the Annual Business meeting.

Pastoral Care & Encouragement: Cards of encouragement were sent to people who have been missed. Pastoral care includes grief counseling for the families who recently lost loved ones. :

Outreach & Missions: The Senior Luncheons continue on the second Saturday of every month. The Missions Festival is in the planning phase for the first weekend in May.






