

Learning Contentment

You ever have a question about how to find something, or what something means? The most popular answer I hear people say when I've asked this question sometimes is, "Google it". So I decided to ask Google a couple questions when I started thinking about the topic of Contentment, just to see what the answer would be. My questions were: "what is contentment; and how do I find contentment in my life?" Google returned about 17,800,000 results in 0.62 seconds.

I was amazed at the number of results in just over a minute, and even more amazed, but not surprised, at some of the answers. As I quickly scanned through some of the answers, and as I suspected prior to my inquiry, the answers would mostly be that of a "worldly view." They talked of obtaining contentment through reaching a certain job status, or a status level of wealth in life by the amount of material possessions you owned.

Reading through the results, I was reminded of the biography of Howard Hughes' life I once watched, and how he died believing the "myth of more". He died a billionaire junkie, insane by all reasonable standards, and not knowing the meaning of contentment in his lifetime. So sad, I thought, because in all reality, as I thought about it, this is how lots of people think; believing in the lie "myth of more" will bring contentment to their lives.

Google also suggested things for cultivating contentment in your life, such as: stop buying stuff you don't need, show people you appreciate them, practice gratitude, learn to enjoy simple things that don't cost money, live in the moment, and so on. FINALLY though, I did find in the results suggestions referring to finding contentment through God. "YESSSS," I said to myself! Although this was an interesting approach to learning the meaning of contentment by doing a Google, it was more saddening to me

the number of questions listed that people had asked on Google pages about finding contentment in their lives.

What I would like to do now is change gears and share with you the best way I learned about finding contentment in my life personally. It started in 2002 when I recommitted my life to Christ. Here's a little history though for those that haven't known me since my early days.

My parents were Christians and I was raised in the Church of God from birth. At a very early age of about 7 years I asked Christ into my life, but not really knowing what it meant, I would have to say. During this time we were attending the Church of God in Chicago, and it wasn't until I became a sophomore in high school and my family started attending Sunny Place, that the true meaning of having Christ in my life hit home. Although I was living the best I knew how for Christ, I had my struggles like a lot of Christians do, ups and downs. (Hint: due to the lack of me trusting God and the Holy Spirit 100%.)

In the early 90s, in frustration, I walked away from Sunny Place and God - a bad decision on my part. During my lost years of not following Christ, he never left me alone. Christ stood at my heart's door and kept knocking. I ignored His knocking and my heart was hardening over the years. As time went on, I heard the knocking less.

In November 2002, our family lost my youngest sister at the age of 40 to death from a sudden illness, devastating us all. At that time I wasn't seeking the Lord, but I was broken by Tricia's death. It was in my brokenness that I heard His voice at the door of my heart again. I opened the door and surrendered my life, asking forgiveness of my past sins. I asked Him to come back into my life and made the commitment that my walk with Him was going to be different this time. I told God

this could only happen by Him and the Holy Spirit living inside me and guiding me everyday for the rest of my life.

Here we are, 18 years later, and it's difficult for me to describe in words the fullness of Christ that I experience in my daily walk with Him. There are three words though that I would say that have brought contentment about, and they would be: commitment, faith and trust.

The COMMITMENT first came in 2002 when I surrendered my all to Christ and asking God for assistance through the Holy Spirit's guidance. This was not a onetime request. This is something I do daily, some days more times than I would like to admit. I can not deal with the flesh, much less survive it; without the help of the Holy Spirit, I'm powerless. However, I've learned as Paul wrote in Philippians 4:13, "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me." To keep my commitment I have to remember this verse regularly to survive.

Also in Romans 8:1-4, we have the assurance of being able to overcome the flesh through the help of the Holy Spirit, "There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.² For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from the law of sin and death.³ For what the law could not do, in that it was weak through the flesh, God sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and for sin, condemned sin in the flesh:⁴ That the righteousness of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit."

Next comes FAITH. I can remember from a very early age memorizing Hebrews 11:1, "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." This verse was instilled in me as a child, and I've seen it come to life time and time again from childhood to the present. All I can say on this one is that there is no doubt in my mind what God can do for me, and for you, if we allow Him to work in our lives.

I can say I understand the secret that Paul wrote about in Philippians 4:11-12: "11 am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. 12 I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want."

But don't just take my word for it, or even if Paul's words to the Philippians wasn't convincing enough; pick up your Bible and open it to Matthew 6:25-34 and read the words that Jesus himself spoke, and allow Him to speak into your heart and fill your life with contentment.







