

#### The Good Good News

"And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord."

--Luke 2:8-11

To the lowly first century shepherds of Bethlehem, these "good tidings" were about to change the world as they knew it. Oppressed, broken and dispirited, the Jewish nation struggled under harsh Roman rule as well as the inescapable and all-encompassing rule of sin in the flesh. By the time Jesus was born, the Jewish history was a long and sorry record of captivity from without and from within. The heaven-sent message of the Savior came to a people who, in the words of Isaiah, "sat in darkness...and in the region and shadow of death." (Matthew 4:16). Yet, within their lifetime, this incredible news of the birth of the King of kings began to bring light into longing hearts and to bring real victory—spiritual victory—throughout the region and eventually the world. These first Gospel bearers faced many hardships, from the rejection of family and friends to torture and death. And yet, despite these difficulties, they persevered, delivering the message of hope to a spiritually starved and dying world.

But what compelled these first followers of Christ to go forth into the world with such boldness and passion? What made this news so important in their hearts and minds that many would choose to leave everything behind in the pursuit of taking the Good News to the neighboring cultures that were often hostile to the revelation of this God and to His deliverance from sin and death? How was this message important to the extent that even two millennia later, Christians in places like the Middle

East, Africa and China are empowered today to spread the Good News in the face of harsh persecution—sometimes to the point of death—as they follow the Master's commission to "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost...."? (Matthew 28:19).

Perhaps a more important question to answer is this: how has the message of the Gospel affected me? Does my life reflect the love, grace and promise that has been given to me by Christ? Do I have the same passion and love for the unsaved that my forefathers in the faith had or that my living sisters and brothers around the world have? Do my neighbors in the house next door or in the adjoining cubicle at work know what I believe? Do I tell them about their need for the Christ who died for all? If not, why not? If I do not have the zeal of those believers who risked all to bear this news to the world, maybe I need to reexamine this good news to gain a fresh appreciation for what I have in Him and what I need to do with Him.

Asking these questions and reading God's Word has caused me to see that the Gospel is more than good news. To be sure, the content of the message is the best news ever given! But even more, it comes from the most real and trustworthy news source of all time. This is critically important to a world full of lop-sided reporting, in which journalists today deliver misleading and subjective coverage, infusing opinions and feelings in news writing that should be detached and objective. Or, quoting so-called experts to give incomplete, misleading or outright false information to back up the real agenda behind a 'news' story. I'm a news junkie, and I try to read as many perspectives as possible, but it has become increasingly difficult to find solid. objective and trustworthy news writing today. In my opinion, the 'fake news' label has been well-earned.

But the Gospel is different. It is good news because the message is good, but it is also trustworthy because the

author is trustworthy. When we hear news today, we must understand that it comes from human beings—fallen and sinsick human beings (Romans 3:23). This means that a news writer must work against his very nature to be truthful and objective in what he reports. Even for Christian writers, this can be difficult, since we are by nature both rational and emotional and we want to report on good or bad news and to tell our readers what we *feel* about it. God, on the other hand, has no such struggle, for He is truth, and His Word is truth and light (He is the Father of Light). So the Gospel fulfils what makes good old-fashioned news: true facts reported truthfully and completely, without omitting or cherry picking information to mislead or misinform the reader. The Good News answers all the important questions of any news story (the who, what, where, when, why and how questions) and it quotes the best authority on any and all subjects: God Almighty! We can trust His angelic news anchors who brought the Best News to the shepherds of Bethlehem and to the world. He is the best and most trustworthy news giver because He is the greatest of all authorities. It is no coincidence that the word 'author' forms the base for the word 'authority.' When we say that a person is the 'authority' on a subject, we recognize his or her depth and breadth of knowledge regarding that particular subject. In the case of the Good News, God is both the highest authority and the author of Salvation and our faith (Hebrews 5:9, 12:2). No one is more qualified or more trustworthy to give the Gospel message!

When I received God's answer to my first prayer, I was astonished. At that time, I was a young journalist, working in a small town at a small town weekly newspaper. I took my writing seriously, and because of good training, I understood the importance of truthful and objective news reporting (I'm thankful for good professors!). My job as a reporter included government matters, crime, features and sports. I was also the photographer and, once a week, I had to set aside my objective news writer hat and write a weekly opinion piece as well. Every Tuesday night was spent both writing articles and developing photos the old-fashioned, pre-digital way: in the dark room with chemicals and rolls of silver chromate-covered film. It was there that I first prayed in earnest to God

I had already prayed to God in that same dark room, asking for proof of His existence and promising to follow Him if He would show Himself to me. And there I was once again when the news came. Instantly I recognized that something about this message was different. For one thing, I hadn't been asking questions about what to do with my life. In fact, I was pressing full steam ahead in the direction I wanted to go. I was following "...the way that seems right to a man...." (Proverbs 14:12). I remember clearly what I had wanted at that time in my life, right down to the number of goals I had established. But in that dark room, the message that came to me gave a clear and unmistakable answer to each one! It didn't take long to look back and realize that the God of the universe had answered not only the questions I was asking and that seemed so important to me, but He answered the questions that I had not asked, and that were really the most important questions of all. I remember that time seemed to stand still while I considered what I had just experienced. Maybe, it was not unlike what those shepherds felt when the night was lit up by the appearance of the angelic messenger who bore the best news of all time to those poor and humble shepherds. I know that the dark room seemed light as day when God answered my prayer to Him!

Now, decades after receiving Christ by faith and accepting His free gift of Salvation, I realize that the Good News is really Good Good News! It's good because we need it so much and it's good because we can trust it completely. It is real news because the Author is real, and He is the Authority of all Authorities. Because He is both omniscient and omnipotent, He can be trusted to deliver the truth.

We believe in God, and so did the ancient Jewish shepherds who tended their flocks in the hills surrounding Bethlehem. Their world was dark, and salvation seemed hopeless. Likewise, our world is dark and full of sin, full of false gods and full of fake news. My prayer is that we may better understand and appreciate the Good News we have in Christ, so that we may face a world full of false and bad news and to hold up the Gospel with fearlessness, faith and love.

#### **Ministry Reports:**

<u>Treasurer:</u> Budgeted Bank Balance: \$1012.15 Giving: \$10462 Expense: \$13795 Faith Promise: \$15950. Nobody has contributed funds through Faithlife Giving yet.

<u>Pastoral Care & Encouragement:</u> Worked on shower for Ellery on March 22. A handout "In Pursuit of Jesus" will be given on Easter Sunday. Eva has been working on visitation with some of the new women attending the church.

<u>Outreach & Missions:</u> Sr. Luncheons going well. Mission's Festival promotion is to begin immediately after Easter. There will be an Outreach outing to visit an orphanage in Chicago on the Saturday of the Fest.

<u>Stewardship & Support Services:</u> Jacob Garcia is now on the team. Only the team members attended the Work Day, so we need to do more to promote this; but a lot was accomplished. Many inside projects were done (16 items): replacing lights, cleaning carpeting, tightening railings, changing filters, etc. Next Work Day is April 25<sup>th</sup>.
