Provision:

Glenda and I recently returned from a trip to Washington DC to visit our new granddaughter, Ella Ann Garcia. She was born on July 27th at 11:51 PM weighing 6 lbs. 11 ozs and 19 inches long. She is truly a precious, beautiful, gift from God. It has been many years since we have had a newborn baby in our family. All the items that new parents need today to care for their baby, have changed a lot since we had our daughter, 44 years ago. I was amazed at all the baby items that Ella's parents had to care for her, such as disposal diapers that show blue lines when wet, variety of infant seats and swings, multi-functional stroller, car seats, and other various items that, I'm not real sure, what function they all provided. While visiting them, we went to a well-known store that sells just about anything you could ever imagine or need to care for a baby. As I was walking through the aisles of this store looking at all the merchandise, I was in awe of all the items that this store has, just for babies. I may be sounding like an old man, but many of these items seemed excessive and overwhelming. One item that I remember seeing was a smart sleep solution bassinet which moves in 11 different move patterns. When you think about how quickly a baby grows out of these items, I'm not real sure how parents are able to afford or do it today.

Being around Ella made me reflect about when we are all born and begin our new life in this world. We come into this world with total dependency on our parents (or adopted parents) to care and provide for all our needs.

Our very survival depends on our parents and their provisioning of food, drink, shelter, clothing, medical care, and security. We are totally reliant on our parents, grandparents, and other care givers, for our very existence. It is impossible for a baby to feed and care for itself.

The remarkable thing is that God, in a similar way, has already made the provision to provide for all our needs while in this world. and for our eternal salvation. We are meant to rely and depend on God for all our provisions; to live a life that is honoring and glorifying to Him. If you follow Jesus and glorify and honor Him, you do not need to worry about your life. God's Word says, "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what your will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life? Matthew 6:25-27 (NIV)

We all have faced life situations and circumstances, that sometimes seem impossible, and very challenging, to get through. We tend to look at our own life situations and wonder how we will ever get through this difficult circumstance. We may say or think things like; I'm not financially, physically, or mentally able, or not capable, for various reasons, to handle and get through our individual life circumstance which we are facing.

I know I have experienced these kinds of life situations many times in my own life. Last year, Glenda and I went through one of those life situations that was very stressful and difficult. Being led by God, we went through a legal process to become guardian of my 86-year-old uncle, who has dementia. Going through this process, we faced one situation that seem to be an impossible legal issue. We needed to setup a required guardianship bank account to care for my uncle's financial needs. We were having a very difficult time finding a banking institute that would accept the court order granting both Glenda and I as legal guardians of my uncle. Several large national banks turned down our request for a guardianship account. As we learned, banks, legally, do not allow two guardians name to be on an account. We were in legal limbo, because the court order, used the word "and" verses the word "or", for Glenda and me, as legal guardians. We found ourselves with no way to financially take care of my uncle's needs, without a guardianship account. We turned to God and prayed for His help. We also asked others to pray about this situation. When all seemed impossible. God answered our prayers and came through by opening a door with a small regional bank. We cried tears of joy and gave the glory to God.
