

## The Three "R"s

The theme for this month is Reclamation, which is generally defined as the process of claiming something back, or of reasserting a right. From a Biblical perspective reclamation can be understood as God's plan for our redemption, which involves rescue, recovery, and restoration. So let's take a moment and readjust our definition accordingly; reclamation is therefore defined as the process of bringing back a person from evil and error. With that in mind, let us move forward by looking to God's word and allow Him to reveal His plan for our salvation through Jesus Christ. As is normal practice when reading something for the very first time, let's start at the very beginning with God's account of Creation.

1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. ... 26 God said, let us make man in our image, according to our likeness: ... 27 So God created man in his own image, ... male and female created he them. ... 31 And God saw everything that he had made, and, behold, it was very good. (Gn. 1:1,26-27,31)

15 And the LORD God took the man and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and keep it. 16 And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: 17 But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, though shall not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die. (Gn. 2:15 - 17)

Now many people, if asked, could probably summarize how humans first sinned and describe their resulting banishment from the garden of Eden which is found in Gn. 3:1 - 24. To be clear, it was the disobedience of Adam and Eve that brought sin into the world, tainted God's perfect creation, and resulted in their spiritual deaths. Due to the constraint of space, I'm unable to share and expound upon every single detail, but for now, let's

focus on the consequences that God speaks to the serpent (Satan).

14 So the LORD God said unto the serpent, Because thou has done this, thou art cursed above all cattle, and above every beast of the field; ... 15 And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; he shall bruise thy head, and thou shall bruise his heel. (Gn. 3:14-15)

As we read, God is foretelling the coming of Jesus Christ (the seed of the woman) and the enmity (war) between Him and His contemporaries (the seed of the Serpent). Now, I'm going to jump from the Book of Genesis to the Gospel of Matthew. But it is important for you to know that the Old Testament contains the prophecies of the Christ, and it is in the New Testament that Jesus Christ fulfils all of them. As we left off in Genesis, God had a plan to send a Savior to rescue us from our sins (willful disobedience).

18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ was on this wise: When as his mother Mary was espoused to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit. 19 Then Joseph her husband being a just man, and not willing to make her a public example, was minded to put her away privily. 20 But while he thought on these words, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a dream, saying, Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. 21 And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shall call his name Jesus: for he shall save his people from their sins. 22 Now all this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, 23 Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name

Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us. (Mt. 1:18 - 23)

16 For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that all who believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. 17 For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved. 18 He that believeth in him is not condemned, but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. (Jn. 3:16 - 18)

25 Whom God hath set forth to be a propitiation through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, ... (Rom 3:25)

2 And he is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only, but also for the sins of the whole world. (1 Jn. 2:2)

Although, we rightly deserve punishment, God takes no pleasure in the death of the wicked. Rather, He desires that we would repent and turn from our wicked ways. God loves His creation so much that He gave us His only son, Christ willingly laid down His life for us, and He took upon Himself the penalty for our sins. But because He Himself was without sin, death could not keep Him, He was resurrected, and now sits at the righthand of His Father in heaven. It is through belief in Christ, along with true Bible conviction (confession and repentance), that God will blot out our sins, the blood of Christ cleanses us from all unrighteousness, and that the Holy Spirit can give life to us. This is true recovery by what God alone has accomplished through His plan and grace that we must be willing to accept.

3 For we ourselves also were sometimes foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving divers lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful, and hating one another. 4 But after that the kindness and love of God our Saviour toward man appeared, 5 Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Spirit; 6 Which he shed on us

abundantly through Jesus Christ our Saviour; 7 That being justified by his grace, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life. (Tit. 3:3 - 7)

11 For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, 12 Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly lives, in this present age; 13 Looking for the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ; who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works. (Tit. 2:11- 14)

There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit. ... 10 And if Christ be in you, the body is dead to sin; but the Spirit is life to righteousness. 14 For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God. Rom. 8:1 - 14)

From the very beginning, God has shown us that sin separates us from Him. Yet, before the foundations of the world, in His infinite wisdom and foreknowledge, He had a plan to redeem us from sin, if we so chose to separate ourselves from Him. The requirements for His salvation are that we be born of the following: from above (of the Father in Heaven), of the water (Christ – the living water), and of the Spirit (the Holy Spirit). If Christ is in us, then we are a new creation; the old self has been put to death, and we are no longer slaves to sin. We can rest assured that He has reconciled us with the Father and our relationship has been restored with Him. Nevertheless, we must keep His commandments, walk as He walked, and be without blemish (sin) in His presence. Then, and only then, can we know and experience the gift of eternal life, which is the earnest inheritance of those who believe.
