The Shipwreck

Pastor Pete prayerfully chooses the theme for each month. When I read "Adventure" as the theme I was taken back; surprised. I couldn't relate my concept of adventure such as Indiana Jones (Harrison Ford) with the Holy Bible, God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit. I think Pastor Pete noticed the confused look on my face. He suggested I was the one to dive into this theme of Adventure. I agreed.

I'm sure each of you has a movie or personal experience that comes to mind when you hear the word, adventure. The challenge I accepted was to relate adventure to Biblical scripture and experiences. As I prayed, a voice whispered, The Whole Bible is a living Adventure. It is the **greatest adventure book** ever written. It took a while for this to sink into my spiritual awareness.

So what does adventure look like? It is defined as unusual, exciting, dangerous, experiences either chosen or occurring without notice. It is hazardous, an exploration of the unknown, bold, risky, with an uncertain outcome or conclusion. A person in an adventure may need to be rescued. With these descriptions in mind, the entire Bible from Genesis to Revelation is a living truthful document of physical and spiritual adventure as we know every word written in the Bible is God-breathed. 2 *Timothy 3:16*

Our Bible brings many physical adventures to our spiritual awareness. Consider Abram leaving his homeland; a hazardous journey "even though he did not know where he was going." Abram was faithful and trusted God to protect him and his family on this trek. Remember Jonah and his three days and nights spent in the belly of a large fish. This was God's way to bluntly confront Jonah with his disobedience. While praying inside, I'm sure Jonah wondered what the outcome of this situation would be. God was there with Jonah and the fish provided transportation closer to God's chosen destination - Nineveh. These adventures were for His purpose. There are so many exciting true adventures in the Bible; it was difficult to choose one for this article. While meditating on God's miraculous powers, Paul's exciting adventure while traveling to Rome came to me. I began reading in Acts 27 and knew this was the spiritual journey to share.

A Warning

When the Apostle Paul was in Jerusalem, he was persecuted for defiling the temple and was going to be killed by an angry mob. The Roman guards interceded and as a Roman citizen, he asked to appeal his case before Caesar in Rome which was his legal right. He was a prisoner under the guard of a centurion named Julius and placed on an Alexandrian ship bound for Italy. With Paul was his faithful travel companion, the physician Luke. Scholars think this journey began in October 59AD. The sailing crew, Roman soldiers and many prisoners, sailed slowly towards their first port, Fair Haven. Paul was given a warning by the Holy Spirit, who knows all things, he shouted:

"Men, I can see that our voyage is going to be disastrous and bring great loss to ship and cargo and to our lives also."

Neither the ship captain, nor Julius, paid heed to Paul's warning, so they set forth with the intention of reaching Phoenix, the next port. After sailing the sea, a wind of hurricane force caught the ship and they were at the mercy of the wind. The waves violently battered the ship, they began throwing cargo overboard. The skies were overcast for weeks. Ships in these ancient times had no compass for navigation. The captain used stars for navigation so when overcast they had no idea of their location. This became a very risky voyage with an uncertain outcome. It was a runaway ship with no safe harbor in sight. But Paul trusted God; he knew God ruled over the surging sea. Paul was visited by an Angel of the Lord who told Paul about the future. Paul told the 276 people aboard the ship, "But now I urge you to keep up your courage because not one of you will be lost; only the ship will be destroyed. Last night an Angel of the Lord whose "I Am" and, whom I serve, stood beside me and said," Do not be afraid Paul. You must stand trial before Caesar and God has graciously given you the lives of all who sail with you." So keep courage men, for I have faith in God that it will happen just as he told me."

Do you ever feel your life has become a runaway ship, without any safe harbor or ability to navigate? At times we can feel lost, doubting our connection with Jesus. Hardship like the waves violently battering our lives can take us to a dark, desolate place. This is when we need to cry out to Jesus who promises to rescue us.

"Because he loves me, says the Lord, I will rescue him; I will protect him for he acknowledges my name." *Psalm 91:14*


"Even in your old age and gray hairs I am he, I am he who will sustain you, I have made you and I will carry you. I will sustain you, I will rescue you." *Isaiah 46:4*

Paul knew Jesus intimately and had no doubts that he and the shipmates would be rescued. But there is still more danger during Paul's journey (see *Acts* 27:27)

The storm continued for two more weeks; the sailing ship was driven across the Adriatic Sea. As experienced sailors, they knew they were approaching land. Some people tried to escape the ship but Paul said," Unless these men stay with the ship you cannot be saved." He urged the men to eat; they took bread and Paul gave thanks to God in front of them all. Like Paul we are called to stand firm in our faith and be grateful for His blessings even during seemingly hopeless situations.

Imagine their joy, at dawn when they saw a bay with a sandy beach. Their joy was short lived as the ship heaved suddenly, struck a sandbar, ran aground, the stern was pounded by the force of the waves and began



to break apart. In desperate fear, the Roman soldiers considered killing all the prisoners, including Paul, because if any escaped, the soldiers would be severely punished. But the centurion Julius interceded and ordered the soldiers not to carry out their plan. It would seem that Julius understood God was in control and God would rescue all of them as Paul revealed.

The final order on the ship was for all who could swim to jump overboard and those who could not swim to hold onto the boards floating from the ship. "In this way everyone reached land in safety" *Acts* 27:44

The shipwreck is an example of lives not dedicated to Jesus. Danger abounds in this world that lacks Jesus. We know "Our God is a God who saves, from the sovereign God comes escape from death." *Psalm 68:20* This verse beautifully describes Paul's harrowing escape from death.

We all need to be rescued at some time in our lives. Being rescued is being saved from a life of darkness. When we are convicted by the Holy Spirit of our sins, and with a repentant heart ask for forgiveness, Jesus will save us. Yielding to Jesus and being sanctified, will bring the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. Each of us will have a different, unique adventure with Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit.

My prayer for each of us is that our adventure with Jesus, and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, will qualify us "to share in the inheritance of the saints in the Kingdom of Light. For God has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sin." *Colossians 1:12-14*

May this article encourage your heart to pursue the adventure of Him always.
