The Gospel Really is Good News

We hear a lot about "fake news" these days, and a good portion of the rest is often "bad news." You have to look a little harder these days to find "good news." I hear of those who are spending less time on Facebook, "following" and "friending" less, and those who are no longer watching the "news" anymore. There is no question the news is so often discouraging, disappointing, and dismal. This has been a challenging year in so many respects: politics, racial injustice, coronavirus, cancel culture, etc.

As consuming as all this can be, however, it is worth taking the time to finding "good news." Yes, you have to sort through a bit more these days, and push aside the fake and bad kinds, but good news is really good for the soul. I am talking, of course, about really good news ... the greatest news: the gospel, the good news of Jesus Christ, the kingdom of God, and salvation. There is no news greater than that. And no message and truth you can invest yourself and your time in that has greater value.

The word "gospel" actually means "good news," or a "good message;" or "good tidings," as we see often in the King James Version. The angel of the Lord was the first to announce it in the account of Jesus' birth. Here is what the angel said:

10 And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. 11 For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord. *Luke 2:10-11 KJV*

We also see it in the account of the beginning

of Jesus' ministry in the very first words of the gospel of Mark, and marked its' start with proclamation of John the Baptist, as prophesied by Isaiah.

1 The beginning of the gospel about Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

2 It is written in Isaiah the prophet:

"I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way"-

3 "a voice of one calling in the desert, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.'" *Mark 1:1-3*

John did exactly that. His message was: "Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand." He completed his mission, preparing the way for Jesus, as we see in the following verses.

14 After John was put in prison, Jesus went into Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God. 15 "The time has come," he said. "The kingdom of God is near. Repent and believe the good news!"

Jesus was now proclaiming it. The good news was the same as what John had been preaching: That the time of the kingdom of God has come; it was now at hand, and it was time to "Repent and believe the good news!" Notice what this looked like:

35 Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. 36 When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. *Matthew 9:35-36* But what was the message, the "news?" What did the people need to "believe?" Jesus explained it like this to Nicodemus:

13 No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven-the Son of Man. 14 Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the desert, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, 15 that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life. 16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. 17 For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. *John 3:13-17*

In the very next chapter, Jesus explains it further to a Samaritan woman.


10 Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

11 "Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? 12 Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his flocks and herds?"

13 Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, 14 but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." *John 4:10-14*

And then finally, Jesus explains it to the unbelieving Jews who rejected Him. He said:

24 "I tell you the truth, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be condemned; he has crossed over from death



to life. 25 I tell you the truth, a time is coming and has now come when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God and those who hear will live. 26 For as the Father has life in himself, so he has granted the Son to have life in himself. 27 And he has given him authority to judge because he is the Son of Man.

28 "Do not be amazed at this, for a time is coming when all who are in their graves will hear his voice 29 and come out-those who have done good will rise to live, and those who have done evil will rise to be condemned." *John 5:24-29*

The good news was that the Son of God, and Son of Man, spoken of by the prophets had come, and the kingdom of God with Him, to invite all who would believe in Him, to repent of their sins, drink of the Living Water, cross from death to life, to eternal life, and be a participant in the resurrection on the day He returns. This is for all who hear His voice, and believe His Father who sent Him.

Do you hear His voice? Do you believe in Him?... Here's what Jesus says to His disciples:

15 He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation. 16 Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned. *Mark* 16:15-16

Repent, then, for the kingdom of God is at hand for you today, as well. Believe and receive Him as your King, and you will drink of living water, you will cross from death to life, you will enter His kingdom, today. You will experience eternal life, now, and the resurrection on that great and glorious day. It is good news to all Creation. There is no greater news than that.

Effie thanked all the people who were able to attend; who worked together for the Glory of God, to fulfill the Worship Service flawlessly. They overcame any technical difficulties with cooperation and phone assistance.
