

Take a Risk for Jesus

As an Operations Manager for two large (24/7) mission critical data center environments, one of my main responsibilities is to identify and mitigate risks that could potentially impact the availability of these data centers. Not all risks are equal in potential consequences. Some activities have a higher degree of risk with a potential adverse effect to the availability of the data centers. Then there are other activities which are more likely to occur but have a considerably smaller degree of risk. One of the prevailing risks to the availability of data centers is human error. There is a tendency as humans to schedule or perform maintenance activities out of convenience versus built-up knowledge of best practices that have been tested and proven to effectively mitigate risks. Another way of saying this is having a focus on self-interests versus the bigger picture of what is best for the overall availability of the data centers. Mitigation of risks has not always been instinctive for me. I had to learn from previous experiences over many years how to be effective at risk management.

In life, our choices and decisions also come with risks. Just like I mention above, not all risks are equal. Some of our decisions have a higher degree of risk and greater potential adverse consequences than others. This reminds me of the following saying my son (nephew), Ricky, would say time and time again when he was growing up. He found it to be a very helpful tool in reminding himself that there were consequences to his choices in life. This saying sounds very much like risk management.

Choices = Decisions = Results = Consequences

What you should ask yourself before you do it!

Who will this effect?
What will happen if I do this?
Will I get in trouble?
Am I doing the right thing?
How will this affect me?
At what cost are you willing to do it?

As Christians, we are called to step out in faith to have an effective impact for the Kingdom of God. Jesus is calling each of us to step out in faith and trust Him. Our flesh and human wisdom may be fearful, and we may perceive what Jesus is asking us to do as being beyond our abilities. Many are reluctant to take a risk for Jesus and would rather play it safe and be served versus serving others. Why do we get so wrapped up in the things of this world? If Jesus is calling you to trust Him and to step out of your comfort zone, you should take notice and listen. Maybe Jesus is calling you to give a sermon, share the gospel with a colleague or neighbor, help feed the hungry, care for the elderly, disciple a new believer, share your testimony, or perhaps serve in a prison ministry. God's work is plentiful. No matter what Jesus is calling you to do, put your trust in Him even if it may seem risky in the eyes of our worldly wisdom. We need to keep our focus on Jesus and be assured that when He is calling us to step out in faith, He is with us and will guide and protect us. With Jesus we have nothing to fear. Jesus is the foremost

authority in risk management. Taking a risk for Jesus should be part of our daily walk with Him. The following scripture from Proverbs was one of the first scriptures that I learned many years ago. For me, this scripture speaks to the core of trusting and taking a risk for Jesus.

Proverbs 3:5-7 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight. Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord and shun evil."

As Christians, we know our God is great and powerful and all things are possible with our Lord. If Jesus is calling you to take a risk for Him, you should take that risk. Taking a risk for Jesus is safe. If you desire a life without fear, accept and become a follower of Jesus. It may sound counterintuitive to the world but following and trusting Jesus will save your life. Not trusting Jesus and ignoring His calling is very risky business that comes will adverse consequences.

Mark 8:35 "For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me and for the gospel will save it."

We ought to be risk takers for Jesus. For many of us, taking risks does not come naturally and others are inherently risk takers. Those who have real faith in Jesus will never need to be afraid to take a risk for Jesus. Put your trust in Jesus and do not be afraid. The Lord is our shield and deliverer. Accept Jesus and live a life without fear no matter what Jesus is calling you to do. As a Christ Follower, you have the promise of everlasting life and the assurance that our prayers will be answered according to His will. Jesus knows the future and what is ultimately the best for us and for the

Ministry Reports:

Treasurer: Budgeted Bank Balanced: \$ 2,934.57, Giving: \$ 18,443, Expense: \$10,164.49 **Worship & Prayer**: Our congregation was spiritually lifted and nourished during the Good Friday Worship Service, the fellowship afterwards, and also the Easter Sunday Worship Service. Many attendees commented on the music and spiritual depth of the services. The Worship leadership team is meeting on a regular schedule for prayer, encouragement, unity and planning. 


Our Sunday Worship Services, and Thursday night Bible will be held at the scheduled times.
