

Greatness Expressed Best

When considering greatness, many things come to mind, but foremost, I think of the unmistakable greatness of our triune God. He is holy, incorruptible, all-knowing, all-powerful, majestic, loving, just and glorious.

Psalm 8:1 says: "O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens."

Let's consider God's greatness as revealed through scripture, beginning with the words of God himself. What does God tell us about his greatness? One place we find his words is in the book of Job.

In the story of Job, the man whom God spoke of as "blameless and upright, a man who fears God and shuns evil" (Job 1:8), we read the account of Job's tragic circumstances brought upon him by Satan, and we see how Job and his friends respond to the calamity in Job's life. To be concise, Job's friends are convinced Job must have sinned, while Job bemoans his losses, defends his righteousness, and then accuses God of being unjust. God's response to Job is truly amazing. He poses questions to Job by describing his own power, majesty and greatness. Here is a brief excerpt from Job 38:4-10.

"Where were you when I laid the earth's foundation? Tell me, if you understand. Who marked off its dimensions? Surely you know! Who stretched a measuring line across it? On what were its footings set, or who laid its cornerstone - while the morning stars sang together and all the angels shouted for joy? Who shut up the sea behind doors when it burst forth from the womb, when I made the clouds its garment and wrapped it in thick darkness, when I fixed the limits for it and set its doors and bars in place, . . ."

God continues to describe his authority, power, and character which are truly remarkable! In the end, Job says "I know that you can do all things; no plan of yours can be thwarted. You asked, 'Who is this that obscures my counsel without knowledge?' Surely I spoke of things I did not understand, things too wonderful for me to know."

Scripture also says many things about the greatness of the Son. "But in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom he made the universe. The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in Heaven." (Heb 1:2 -3)

Colossians 1 and 2 beautifully depict the supremacy and glory of Christ. Colossians 2:9 -10 says "For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form, and you have been given fullness in Christ, who is the head over every power and authority

"The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth." (John 1:14)

During Jesus' ministry, the people saw the greatness of his power as demonstrated in his unequaled miracles, authoritative teaching, and sacrificial love. Throughout the gospels, we see example after example of the greatness of Jesus expressed through his compassion and desire to see all people reconciled to him, ultimately expressed on the cross, where Jesus took our place. "Greater love hath no man than this, that a

man lay down his life for his friend." (John 15:13)

What does scripture say about the greatness of the Holy Spirit? To answer that, we need to consider the Spirit's purpose, which is to enable the Church.

The Holy Spirit convicts of sin (John 16:7-11), is our helper (John 14:26), gives wisdom (Isaiah 11:2), understanding (1 Cor. 2:10), power (Acts 1:8), spiritual gifts (1 Cor.12:1-11), guidance (Romans 8:14), discernment (Heb 5:14), and intercedes on our behalf (Romans 8:26).

Who, then, ought we to be?

For those of you who remember, Mohammed Ali, born Cassius Clay and nicknamed 'the Greatest', he was a gold medal Olympic boxer and one of the best known American professional boxers. He would often say of himself, "I'm the greatest!". I remember his frequent boasts well. Cassius Clay considered himself great because of his boxing abilities, but what about the rest of us? Are we great? We were, after all, created in the image of God? What does scripture say about human greatness? Is it the kind that Mohammed Ali boasts of?

When we look at the patriarchs and the prophets, those whom we consider great, it was because of their faith and obedience. While the church can look at these men and women as examples of doing great things, the answers to the church's greatness lies in the example of Jesus.

Philippians 2:5-11 "In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross! Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue

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acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

In Matthew, we find that the mother of James & John came to Jesus to ask that her sons sit at his right and left in his kingdom. She was asking that her sons would be glorified (great). The disciples became indignant, but how did Jesus respond?



In the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector (Luke 18:14), Jesus said "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Ultimately, Jesus expressed greatness best when sharing the two greatest commandments: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." (Matthew 22:37)
