

The Cross is the Bridge to Eternal Life


In pondering on "bridge building" the first thoughts that came to me were "connecting point A to point B" or getting from "here to there." Realizing that I was thinking about it in the literal sense why bridges are built and what the purpose a bridge serves, I decided to look up the meaning of these two words put together in the dictionary to find if there were other meanings of the saying. In the Collins British English dictionary, I found "bridge building" is defined as "an effort to establish communications friendly and contacts between people to make them friends or allies." As I kept thinking on the topic at hand my mind began turning to the spiritual meaning of bridge building.

I recently read an article by Adrian Williams, called "Bridge Building: The Time is Now." (ourchristschurch.com, June 20, 2020). I would like to share some nuggets from the article with you that spoke to me after seeing and living through the events of this last year.

Williams writes, "In the aftermath of the murder of George Floyd in May of 2020, accompanied by nationwide protest, believe that our country is coming to grips with an unsettling truth—we are a nation colors and hues. many socioeconomic backgrounds, and places of origin, but we don't really know each other. Sure, we may be more familiar with those with whom we share cultural norms. economic status, and those who look like us, but as those similarities decrease so does our familiarity with who they really are. Thus, we need to bridge those divides."

After reading those words, I was reminded of how much we all saw and personally experienced since the start of 2020 from Covid to the marches, riots, and to the racial attacks on our nation. As I sat and thought about the struggles we are facing as individuals and a nation, I asked myself "how can we bridge divides?" The answer immediately came to mind, Jesus!

JESUS IS the master bridge builder who willingly laid down on a cross, shed His blood and gave His life for you and me. He became the bridge for you and me. He paid the ramson which gave us the access to the narrow road, from a life of sin to eternal life.



1 Timothy 2:5-6 has come to my mind more than once lately, "⁵ For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus; ⁶ Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time." As Christians, so what does the word "bridges" mean for you and me?

Williams goes on to say "Bridges are fascinating because they are designed to bring things together—land masses, roads, and people. I have found my life as a Christian to be exciting for the very same reason, because now I get to be a

bridge builder for Christ. Of course, Jesus is the only mediator between God and man (see 1 Timothy 2:5); but, acting under his authority, Christians have the privilege of building bridges also. What kind of bridges can we build today? Christians and non-Christians alike often have barriers that keep us from experiencing that intimacy with Christ and each other. Just as Jesus left Heaven to come and mingle with the sinful world, he has left us with the glorious task of creatively penetrating our world with the good news."

As exciting as it sounds, to have the privilege to build bridges, we must first consider do we have what it takes to build a bridge? Have we allowed God to equip us for this task? In thinking about bridge building and potential barriers, how do we achieve and experience fellowship with God and one another? To me, I see it as simple, as it comes down to a relationship based on love, trust, and two-way communication through us reading, listening, and obeying God's word. Reading our Bible and praying for Him to write His words on our hearts and in our minds by His Holy Spirit. Which are essential to establishing a "bridge of communication" between God and us, His children.

There are three scripture passages that come to my mind that reinforce the importance of a bridge of communication.

Psalms 119:5 "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path."

Proverbs 3:5-6, "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding.⁶ In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths."

2 Timothy 3:16-17 "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: ¹⁷ That the man of

God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works."

We must each ask ourselves "How much time do I spend reading my Bible or in prayer?" "Have I allowed God to equip me for His work?" "Is my bridge of communication strong or weak?" Think about it for a second or two, food for thought.

When we are in the right relationship with God and the bridge of communication is established, He can then use us to reach others. At this instance I can't help but think of our brother Sam Jacob who has shared various parts of his life story with us both publicly and at times one on one. How many times have we heard Sam say, "What's your story?" or "Tell me more."? Williams calls this approach "bridge building understanding and relationships". When we share our stories and when we listen to others share their story with us, it provides a glimpse into who we each are as individuals, what we think, and why we think and behave as we do. It opens doors of understanding; it builds trust and relationships.

Most importantly, it provides with us opportunity to share the gospel message with others and tell them about Christ. When this are being "gospel bridge happens, we builders." Because we are sharing with them God's plan for our salvation through the shedding of Christ's blood on the cross for the remission of past sins. By this we are reconciled with God the Father and have access to His Holy Spirit to live godly lives. In doing this we not only share the words of life with others, which were once shared with us, but we are being faithful and obedient servants by fulfilling the great commission.

Matthew 28:19-20a "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit: ²⁰ Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you."
