

Triumph in Christ

Before you start reading this article, STOP. What was the first thought that came to your mind when you read the word TRIUMPH?

When I picked the theme "Triumph" to write about, one of the first thoughts that came to my mind was the victory (battle) that was won at Calvary, when Christ died on the cross for you and me. We received remission when we came to Christ and repented of our sins; we were given a new life and hope for our future, a reason we can triumph and give praise to God.

Curious to find out what others thought the word triumph meant, I asked a couple of people. My thoughts were soon to be broadened by their responses. One person said, "a victory or battle won." "Okay..." I thought their thought was like my thinking; but then I wondered, are "victory" and "triumph" the same? I shared with another person my thoughts on triumph. Their response to me was "Yes, the victory was won on Calvary, but the BATTLE is still raging." These responses brought several thoughts to my mind, which I would like to share with you.

After researching the meanings of victory vs. triumph, I concluded they are connected, but not quite the same in meaning. Victory is different from Triumph.

Victory is used to highlight the fact that someone achieved the highest possible rating from a competition or a war. In simple terms, you have won by competing against a competitor, or defeating an opponent or enemy. Thinking about victory from a spiritual perspective, this is what Christ did for you and me. He went up against the flesh and Satan in a war for us, defeating them so that through Him salvation could be offered to all. His blood was shed on Calvary. He paid for our sins the ultimate price for our redemption as the Lamb of God, as the sacrifice for our sins. The victory was won, but my colleague is right, "the battle is still raging."

If Satan was so bold to tempt the Son of Man, Jesus, God in the flesh, how much more is he willing to tempt us as easy prey?

With that in mind, Peter instructs us, "Be sober, be vigilant: because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion walketh about, seeking whom he may devour." 1 Peter 5:8 (KJV)

And Paul reminds us that we are in a war, and he gives us the recipe on how we are to arm ourselves for the fight. "¹⁰ Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. ¹¹ Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. ¹² For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places. ¹³ Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand." Ephesians 6:10-13 (KJV)

But wait, there's more! Here's where another important part comes into play: the triumph we can and will experience through what Christ did for us!

Imagine yourself climbing a mountain and the goal is to reach the top. You would put forth effort and determination to conquer fears, obstacles, and even overcome disasters perhaps. Being willing, or unwilling, to do what it takes will define the outcome as a success or a failure as you attempt to reach the top. Yet, if you are successful, and make it to the top, it's called a "triumph."

Jesus gave His all, including His life, to finish His mission, and, on the cross, declared, "it is finished." Success in the eyes of God!

Since we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus, there can be no "true" success

apart from Christ. There can be no triumph until we engage in His work, and live through His victory in our own lives. He is the one that empowers us to be victorious.

Don't allow yourself to believe in Satan's lie that says, "you are not succeeding." If we stay connected to Christ – Christ living in us, trusting and obeying, following God's written word - we will always triumph. We learn. We conform. We grow. We work. We overcome.

¹⁴ Now thanks be unto God, which always causeth us to triumph in Christ... 2 Corinthians 2:14a (KJV)

The key word in the Scripture above is "always." Knowing that we always triumph in Christ eliminates the false statement, "win a few—lose a few." Just because it is God's will that we always triumph doesn't ensure that we will never be attacked, or have trouble come knocking at the door in our lives.

In God's mind, victory belongs to us. No matter what kind of persecution, adversity, or attack you may come under, God's plan results in triumph when we are obedient to Him. So, even when things seem difficult, aren't always perfect, nor easy, you can rest assured that you'll have the victory in the end through Christ.

Remember these promises:

¹¹ For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Jeremiah 29:11 (NIV)

Paul wrote, "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose." Romans 8:28 (KJV)

We must rest on this truth, knowing that even "bad" circumstances will somehow work together for our good.

So therefore...

One last thing: when thinking about the word TRIUMPH, I was reminded of my youth while growing up at Sunny Place where we often sang songs that were based on Scripture. And I want to share one of them with you, which was written by James Lloyd Owens in 1972, based on verses written in Psalms 47:

"Clap your hands, all ye people Shout unto God with a voice of triumph Clap your hands, all ye people Shout unto God with a voice of praise

Hosanna, hosanna Shout unto God with a voice of triumph Praise Him, praise Him Shout unto God with a voice of praise"

The psalmist was acknowledging God's greatness, His Kingship, His relationship to the earth and the people. Let's raise our voices to Him in praise and TRIUMPH!
