

A Glorious Crown of Beauty

It has been said that beauty is in the eye of the beholder. That seems to hold true in most of what we experience in life. But have you ever met anyone who doesn't recognize beauty at all? Although we might not all agree precisely on what is beautiful, beauty is something we all have a sense of and recognize.

Beauty, it seems then, is all around us in some form or fashion. And therefore I would say that beauty is ubiquitous and pervasive. And I think the reason it is, is that God created us in His image.

We recognize beauty because God made us in such a way that we have the capacity to see beauty. He created a magnificent world and universe. He created wonderful plants and creatures. And His most beautiful of all are those He created in His image. We are amazing beings. So, whether you look through a microscope, or a telescope, or just with your naked eye, you see beauty. In whatever way you see beauty, it is there for you to enjoy.

Not everything is beautiful, however – not anymore, anyway. Over the millennia, the world and the Creation have been marred and corrupted by the effects of sin. I'm not only talking about the physical effects, but also the human toll it has taken. Selfish hearts have taken advantage of others. People are oppressed, abused, and scandalized.

That, as we know, is the reason, God recognized from the beginning that a plan of salvation for the world would be needed. The heart of the LORD was broken by the sin and violence that He foresaw, and actually transpired in the course of time. So, the Holy Spirit revealed to the prophets that a Savior would come. This Savior was to be the Anointed One, God in flesh, the Son of God. And He would bring beauty back to a remnant of those who were burdened because of sin and would cry out for His mercy. Listen to the words of the prophet:

1 The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners,

2 to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn,

3 and provide for those who grieve in Zion, to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair.

They will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the LORD for the display of his splendor.

Isaiah 61:1-3

You might recall that Jesus repeated these words in the synagogue of His hometown, and said, "Today, this Scripture is fulfilled in your hearing." (Luke 4:21) It is a beautiful passage that reflects the compassion and love He has for the brokenhearted and oppressed, and the comfort He seeks to bring them. But notice in verse 3 of the Isaiah passage, that instead of the ashes of grief and mourning they had been suffering through, He would bestow on them beauty — oil of gladness instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair.

Jesus came into this world to save the hurting and lost – to break the chains of those enslaved by their sins. He fulfilled what the Holy Spirit announced and Isaiah penned. But we don't want to miss the crown of beauty that He bestows. He adorns us with beauty. All that was soiled and marred is washed away, and we are given new garments, and at last, the crown of beauty.

But what exactly is this crown? ... Isaiah has the answer.

5 In that day the LORD Almighty will be a glorious crown, a beautiful wreath for the remnant of his people.

6 He will be a spirit of justice to him who sits in judgment, a source of strength to those who turn back the battle at the gate.

Isaiah 28:5-6
