

## Support from God to Heal Your Broken World

On June 11th, 1991, my world changed inside out. My femur shattered due to a traumatic motor vehicle accident in India. I never knew the importance of the femur until that day. I was in the hospital for a few days, and the surgeon reconstructed the broken femur and placed a rod inside for my support.

There are many supportive resources and strategies available in our world. However, choosing the proper support is vital for our well-being.

In my Spiritual care practice, I assess with my 3F support strategy, where I explore my patients' support systems. These are Faith, Family, and Friends. For me, it was, and it is Jesus, the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, my Counselor and my Comforter. He healed my broken world without an ounce of physical pain, surprising the whole medical team and the world around me.

The first step is to acknowledge that we need support. Let me share an example of what I see in my own backyard. I have planted a pear tree in our garden that gives us a lot of pears every year. Now it bears so much fruit that the branches cannot hold it anymore and the branches

break. The problem is that it does not have a proper support system specific to the area of weakness. I have learned to trim some branches at the bottom and add some rods to keep the fruit-bearing branches up. Similarly, we need the Holy Spirit to prune and add support, especially from those who are the Holy Spirit-filled and overflowing people of God.

The second step is to trust God, who is capable (expert) in the area. The One who created you. The One who died for you. The One who resurrected and conquered sin and its weaknesses. The One who is strong enough to bear your weight and hold you up. He is Jesus, my Lord, and Savior.

Thousands of years ago, the prophet Isaiah said:

'Fear not, for I am with you; Be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you; yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand.' Isaiah 41:10

The third step is to allow the Healer to

do the procedure. Spiritually speaking, our response should be to run toward Him and share our fear and pain with Him. Don't let the fear destroy you. Don't let your pain kill you. Don't let the sadness overtake you. He will meet us wherever we are. We need to have a trusting and intimate relationship with Him, so He can help and strengthen us, thereby we experience His actual presence and strength.

Let me share a Scripture that the Lord helped me with when I was traumatized,

"...Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine.
When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you.
When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze.
For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior..."
Isaiah 43:1b-3a

Let us acknowledge that we need support. Let us trust in the everlasting arms of God. Let us allow ourselves to be healed and empowered by His Holy Spirit. Then we can


