

Let God Be Your Shield

In preparation to write this article on "Vulnerability", I started with looking up its definition. It is defined by the Cambridge Dictionary as "able to be easily physically or mentally hurt, influenced, or attacked". I find it interesting that when I was in my teenage years until about my late twenties, I had what I call the Superman syndrome. I was invincible. I didn't fear anything, or shall we say I didn't know better. I wasn't a Christian yet, though I think this invincible mentality may be somewhat common for a lot of young men.

During my twenties I worked in the construction trades as a Tuck pointer. As a Tuck pointer, I work on hundreds of tall buildings throughout the Chicagoland area. Back then, I had no fear of heights and thought I was invincible. This work involved working on swing stage scaffolding. In case you are wondering what a swing stage scaffold is, it is exactly what is sounds like. A platform that is suspended from the roof of a building by either a cable or rope on each end of the scaffold. Sometimes on a windy day, the wind would get a hold of the scaffold and take you for a ride and blow the scaffold away from the building wall, like a swing. On these windy days, there was no need to go to an amusement park for the thrill of riding the roller coasters. I had such great confidence in my abilities that I would volunteer to work on some of the more dangerous jobs with no thought of the physical dangers which were involved (a la Superman syndrome). I was fortunate to have never been hurt while working in the trades as a Tuck pointer. Unfortunately, I did witness and heard of other Tuck pointers that weren't as fortunate as I, and some did get seriously hurt while working on the job.

I left the Tuckpointing trade in my late twenties for a variety of reasons, but mainly because God was beginning to work within my heart as I was searching for the meaning of life. I needed a change and God opened the doors for me to make a change in my work life and eventually also in my spiritual life. There is no way today I could work as a Tuck pointer again. It's a young man's endeavor. I have a great respect of heights today. I now know that a fall from as little as six feet is enough to kill you. I've heard it said, it's not the fall that kills you, it's the sudden stop when you land. Life has taught me that I am not invincible, especially with heights. Since I left the trades and decided to follow Him, God has been my shield through all of life's vulnerabilities.

In this life, there are many vulnerabilities we face due to our human imperfections. Just to name a few, these could include physical illness, mental and emotional afflictions, our relationships with others, human fears, spiritual immaturity, and ignoring God's will. We are weak and vulnerable without Christ in our lives. With Christ we can overcome anything in this life. Such was the case of Paul the Apostle. During much of the first half of his life, Paul was a Pharisee. He was very good at persecuting Christians. Until God interceded in Paul's life. Paul was on his way to Damascus when he had a vision that changed his life. In Galatians 1:16, God revealed his Son to him. Paul was converted and became a faithful follower of Jesus Christ. Throughout Paul's ministry he faced many vulnerable situations because he openly and publicly taught that Jesus was the Son of God. Paul encountered beatings, being jailed, and was eventually martyred for Christ. Paul the Apostle wrote in 2 Corinthians 12:9-10 (NIV): But he said to me. "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weakness, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weakness, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

In the bible there are numerous stories of God helping people overcoming their vulnerabilities to carry out God's perfect plan of salvation for the world. During our Christian walk, we too will face many vulnerabilities that can affect us is in many ways. We need to stay the course and not lose sight of our role in God's plan of salvation for the world. God has the perfect plan for each of us that will help us see our way through whatever vulnerabilities or trials we face. Just like with Paul, God's power shows up greatest when we overcome our vulnerable situations. We may not be able to see the future or know exactly when or how we'll come out on the other side. Christ will see us through no matter what hardships or difficulties we may face in this world. We have His assurance that we will not be alone in this life. In John 14:18-19 (NIV): I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. Before long, the world will not see me anymore, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live.



In my life, I like things that are straightforward and simple to understand. Jesus said it perfectly In Matthew 22:37-40 NIV. Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and Prophets hang on these two commandments." None of us know what tomorrow holds for us. But whatever we face, we need to Love God and our fellow neighbors as we rely on Jesus to guide us each and every day.

Our flesh and human wisdom may be fearful when we face vulnerable situations in our life, and we may perceive whatever we are facing is beyond our abilities. Not so when we love and obey Christ. Paul showed great courage and love for our Lord when he faced hardships and persecutions throughout his ministry. In John 14:23-24 (NIV): Jesus replied, "If anyone loves me, he will obey my teachings. My Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home

Vulnerability takes courage and makes us stronger to carryout God's plan and will for our life's. All the glory belongs to God. *Ephesians 3:20-21 (NIV): Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever!
